Swartland Bulletin – Hartland van die Swartland

Munisipale bestuur gaan lank reeds nie meer bloot oor die voorsiening van dienste soos water, krag en riolering nie: by Swartland Munisipaliteit word daar toenemend aandag gegee aan sosiale probleme en gemeenskapsontwikkeling.

Swartland het volgens die 2011-sensus 'n bevolking van 113 762. Die gemiddelde groei tussen 1996 en 2001 was 2% per jaar. Tussen 2001 en 2011 het dit tot 4,7% verhoog. Swartland was ook die tweede vinnigste groeiende munisipaliteit in die Wes-Kaap vir dié tyd.

Wat bevolking betref, is Swartland nou die sesde grootste munisipaliteit uit 24 in die Wes-Kaap (metro's uitgesluit) en die grootste in die Weskus-distrik.

Munisipale bestuurder Joggie Scholtz sê die belangrikste aspekte in 'n goeie munisipaliteit is leierskap en goeie bestuur. Onder leierskap het hy onder meer genoem dat 'n leier moet begin met die einde in gedagte.

Etiese besigheidspraktyke, behoorlike stelsels en oorsig deur bestuur is ook belangrik.

Goeie bestuur sluit in dat daar nie net voldoen word aan vereistes nie, maar dat die verbeter word. Risiko-bestuur, interne audit en 'n auditkomitee en geen verdraagsaamheid ten opsigte van bedrog en korrupsie, is van die ander hoekstene.

“Dit beteken dat ons nou aandag kan gee aan die ware kwessies, ons kan 'n kultuur van prestasie kweek, innoverende doelwitte stel en gapings aanspreek”, het hy verduidelik.

Scholtz sê van die belangrikste behoeftes in die gemeenskap sluit toegang tot behuising, skoon water, sanitasie, elektrisiteit en vullis-verwydering in.

Burgemeester Tijmen van Essen sê sake is landwyd moeilik, in die provinsie en ook in die Swartland: “Aan die een kant het ons om verskeie redes 'n baie lae ekonomiese groei, maar baie hoë verwagtinge, nie net wat 'polities' geskep word nie, maar ook ingevolge die Nasionale Ontwikkelingsplan (NP).

Tog het hulle weer eens daarin geslaag om 'n begroting op te stel wat aandag gee aan die armstes van die armes (“pro-poor”) en ook 'n pro-infrastruktuur begroting. “Ons ervaar vele uitdagings, omdat ons waarskynlik die slagoffers van ons eie sukses is”, het Van Essen bygevoeg.

It has been a long time since municipal management was concerned merely with the provisioning of services such as water, electricity and sanitation. At Swartland Municipality, we focus increasingly on social problems and community development.

According to the 2011 census, Swartland has a population of 113 762. The average growth between 1996 and 2001 was 2% per annum. Between 2001 and 2011, that increased to 4,7%. During the same time, Swartland was also the second fastest growing municipality in the Western Cape.

In terms of the population, Swartland is currently the sixth largest municipality among 24 in the Western Cape (excluding metros) and the largest in the West Coast district.

Municipal Manager Joggie Scholtz believes the most important characteristics of a solid municipality are leadership and sound management. In terms of leadership, he mentioned among other things that a leader should begin with the end in mind.

Ethical business practices, proper systems and review by management are also important.

Sound management involves not only meeting the requirements, but also exceeding them. Risk management, internal audits, audit committees and zero tolerance to fraud and corruption complete the foundation.

“This means we are now able to attend to fundamental issues, establish a culture of performance, set innovative goals, and fill in gaps,” he explained.

Scholtz said the most important needs in the community include access to housing, clean water, sanitation, electricity and refuse removal.

Mayor Tijmen van Essen said things are difficult across the country, in the province and also in the Swartland: “On the one hand we are experiencing very low economic growth for various reasons, while on the other we have extremely high expectations, not only those created politically, but also those provided under the National Development Plan (NDP).

“Nevertheless, the budget was again drafted as a budget that favours the poorest of the poor (‘pro-poor’) and is also a ‘pro infrastructure’ budget. We are facing many challenges, probably because we are the victims of our own success,” van Essen added.

Voorwoord by die tweede Swartland Bulletin

Die vorige boekjaar het weer etlike unieke hoogte- en laagtepunte opgelewer; laagtepunte veral op die finansiële front, waar die Munisipaliteit (nes al die ander plaaslike owerhede) onder die nagevolge van die wêreldwye ekonomiese krisis gely het.

Aan die positiewe kant is dit gepas om te meld dat die Swartland Munisipaliteit vier jaar ná mekaar skoon oudits ontvang het, nl. vir die 2010/11, 2011/12, 2012/13 en die 2013/14 finansiële jaar. Die uitdaging is om die prestasie te kan volhou.

Die komende jare gaan innoverende, strategiese denke van die Munisipaliteit verg, iets waartoe ons onvoorwaardelik verbind is. Ons het reeds ons mees kritiese risiko's geïdentifiseer en gedokumenteer, en implementeer tans aksieplanne vir elke risiko, ten einde ons finansiële stabiliteit in die langtermyn te verseker.

Ten spyte hiervan was ons bevoorreg om in die afgelope jaar te kon voortgaan om gehaltdienste aan ons belastingbetalers te lewer. Ons sal so aanhou, ondanks die uitdagings wat vir ons voorlê. Die Kliëntedienshandves en die diensstandaarde wat daarin gestel word, bly een van die instrumente waarvolgens ons ons prestasie meet.

Ons streef steeds daarna om ons belastingbetalers trots te maak en is verbind tot uitmuntende prestasie. Daarvoor moet ons kliënte en/of vennote egter ook hulle verantwoordelikheid besef deur te verstaan dat verskeie prioriteite aandag benodig; 'n verantwoordelikheid om redelik te wees, en om te vertrou dat ons hulle belange op die hart dra.

Ons poog om deurgaans professioneel en deursigtig te bly in ons sake met u.

Swartland Munisipaliteit het gedurende Oktober en November 2014 'n kliëntediens-opname onder inwoners gedoen om die tevredenheid met dienslewering te bepaal, in opvolg op die 2012-opname. Die vrae was dieselfde as die vorige opname ten einde die resultate te kan vergelyk. Die oorhoofse gemiddelde punt was 70,8%. Die opname is deur die Munisipaliteit self gedoen teen 'n nominale koste. Die 2014-opname se vraeys kon òf in elektroniese formaat deur middel van Survey Monkey op die internet ingevul word òf op papier by verskeie plekke in die munisipale gebied. Uiteindelik is 367 vraeyste (47%) op papier ingevul en 416 (53%) elektronies. Die papier-vraeys se resultate is natuurlik ook op Survey Monkey ingevoer. Foreword to 2nd Swartland Bulletin

The previous financial year once again offered some unique ups and downs, the latter especially on the financial front, with the municipality (like all other local authorities) suffering the after effects of the global economic crisis.

On the positive side it is appropriate to report that the Swartland Municipality achieved four consecutive clean audits for the 2010/11, 2011/12, 2012/13 and 2013/14 financial years. The challenge is now to maintain this achievement.

The years ahead require innovative strategic thinking by the municipality, something to which we have committed ourselves unconditionally. We have already identified and documented our most crucial risks, and are busy implementing action plans in respect of such risks to ensure our financial stability in the long term.

Despite all, we were fortunate that we could continue rendering quality services to our rate-payers during the past year. We will continue doing so, despite the challenges we face. The service standards set in the Client Services charter will remain one of the instruments whereby we will measure our performance.

We will keep on striving to make our ratepayers proud and are committed to performance excellence. However, to do so, our clients and/or partners also have to realise their responsibility to understand there are various priorities requiring attention; a responsibility to be reasonable, and a responsibility to trust that we have your interests at heart.

We endeavour to remain professional and transparent in our dealings with you, at all times.

During October and November 2014, Swartland Municipality conducted a client services survey among residents to determine their satisfaction with service delivery, i.e. as a follow-up to the 2012 survey. In order to compare the results, the questions were the same as those used for the previous survey. The overall average mark was 70,8%.

The Municipality conducted the survey itself at a nominal cost. The questionnaire for the 2014 survey could be completed either electronically on the internet, i.e. through Survey Monkey, or on paper at various places in the municipal area. In the end, 367 questionnaires (47%) were completed on paper, while 416 (53%) were completed electronically. The results of the paper questionnaire were also captured on Survey Monkey. The number of responses (783) was 125% more than the 348 of the previous survey. (Please see the results elsewhere in the Bulletin.)

That is how Municipal Manager Joggie Scholtz recently explained the Municipality’s vision to a delegation of the Western Cape Department of Human Settlements.</i></p> <p><i>Scholtz said understanding and leadership are qualities required to ward off poverty. “We should always remember that the general public do not care which tier of government is responsible for a particular service – they merely want results. That is why it is important to join hands and stand together.”</i></p> <p><i>Swartland’s waiting list currently stands at 16 468. In future, the list will be categorised to provide for aspects such as disability, age, the extent of the family, services required and backyard dwellers.</i></p> <p><i>The Provincial Department of Human Settlements appointed CK Rumboll and Partners to review Swartland’s Human Settlement Plan (HSP) and come up with suggestions concerning gaps.</i></p> <p><i>The Department requires municipalities to create settlements that are sustainable: by providing opportunities in a town, with sufficient socio-economic facilities and job opportunities.</i></p> <p><i>The Council has already approved this plan in principle, subject to final approval by the Department of Human Settlements.</i></p> <p><i>The execution of projects is also subject to the availability of funds, suitable land and bulk services in the various towns.</i></p>
<p>Abbotsdale kry Biblioteek</p> <p>Die Provinsiale Regering (Biblioteekdienste) het 'n bedrag van R5 miljoen oor twee jaar bewillig vir 'n nuwe biblioteek op Abbotsdale. Die biblioteek moet teen 30 Junie 2017 voltooi wees.</p> <p>Gebaseer op dié dorp se 2011-bevolkingsyfers van 13 018 inwoners, sal 'n gebou van sowat 500 m² opgerig word. Drie potensieële persele, geleë binne die nuwe behuisingprojek, is reeds geïdentifiseer.</p> <p>Abbotsdale is een van vyf nuwe biblioteek-projekte wat in die 2015/16 boekjaar sal begin. Die ander vier is in Du Noon, Stellenbosch, Mosselbaai en Langeberg.</p> <p>Provinsie het R360,6 miljoen aan biblioteke en argiewe toegestaan.</p>	<p>Abbotsdale to get library</p> <p><i>Provincial Government: Library Service has allocated R5 million over two years for a new library in Abbotsdale, to be completed by 30 June 2017.</i></p> <p><i>The building will be about 500 m² in size so that it can service the town’s 13 018 residents (according to the 2011 population figure). Three potential premises situated within the new housing project have already been identified.</i></p> <p><i>The Abbotsdale library is one of five new library projects that will be started in the 2015/16 financial year; the other four are in Du Noon, Stellenbosch, Mossel Bay and Langeberg.</i></p> <p><i>Province has allocated R360.6 million in total to libraries and archives.</i></p>

Dit het die vermoë om 2000 kiloliter riool per dag te hanteer en dit is voldoende vir ongeveer 4000 huishoudings.</p> <p>Die Munisipaliteit onderneem hierdie projek om 'n bydrae te lewer tot 'n skoner omgewing en om die probleme met die besoedeling wat ondervind word in die Bergrivier aan te spreek.</p>	<p>Sewage plant progressing rapidly</p> <p><i>The new sewage plant in construction at Riebeek Kasteel is progressing by leaps and bounds.</i></p> <p><i>The total project cost amounts to R73,8 million: PPC contributes R5 million, the central government R37 million, while the remaining R31,8 million comes from Swartland Municipality.</i></p> <p><i>The plant is located on the premises of the existing sewage works and uses an activated sludge purification process.</i></p> <p><i>Part of the project comprises a pipeline that provides a connection between the new plant, Riebeek West and Ongegund. The existing sewage plants at Riebeek West and Ongegund will subsequently be phased out and sewage will be fed through this pipeline to the new plant.</i></p> <p><i>Where in the past we had three small plants, only one plant will now be in operation for the entire Riebeek Valley.</i></p> <p><i>The new plant will be put into operation by May 2015. It has the capacity to handle 2 000 kilolitre of sewage per day and will be sufficient for some 4 000 households.</i></p> <p><i>The Municipality drives this project as a contribution to a cleaner environment and a way to address problems with pollution in the Berg River.</i></p>

The ability of the existing routes to carry the increased traffic is being scrutinised.</i></p> <p><i>“There are no easy or instant solutions. Issues that are being investigated are:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>The proposed circle that will divert traffic from Smuts and Rosenberg Roads, past McDonalds and over the bridge to the various towns. That includes a new access route to the sports grounds.</i> • <i>The bridge over the Diep River will be widened with two entrance lanes and one exit lane.</i> <p><i>Previous studies found that the bridge could be widened safely, without having to change the physical bridge structure, by simply adjusting the surface of the current pedestrian lanes to be level with the current roadways, strengthening the surface and then dividing the existing surface into three lanes.</i></p>

Dit hou implikasies in vir die gedeelte wat uiteindelik as bewaringsgebied sal kwalifiseer.</p> <p>"Ons probeer op die oomblik te motiveer dat die toekomstige padroete buite-om Klipkoppie moet gebeur," verduidelik me Terblanche.</p> <p>"Ons gaan binnekort borde aanbring om die publiek op die bewaringstatus te wys, maar wil mense maan om by die bestaande roetes op Klipkoppie te hou wanneer hulle dit wel gebruik, om erosie en ander skade te verhoed."</p>	<p><i>Klipkoppie must be protected</i></p> <p><i>Swartland Municipality and CapeNature are concerned about residents using the well-known and well-loved Klipkoppie for all kinds of purposes.</i></p> <p><i>"There's no proper policing and we're worried about potential erosion and damage to plants," says Madelaine Terblanche, Director Corporate Services.</i></p> <p><i>"The public must be made aware that Klipkoppie does have conservation status, even though it hasn't yet been proclaimed as a conservation area."</i></p> <p><i>The terrain, when it is registered under the Protected Areas Act as a conservation area, will qualify for the highest status because it is regarded as a critical biodiversity area due to the renosterbos and other rare plant species that grow there.</i></p> <p><i>"At this stage, we and CapeNature aren't yet in the position to have it proclaimed as a conservation area because the implications of the West Coast Integrated Transport Plan aren't clear yet.</i></p> <p><i>"This plan, which is currently being drawn up, may take the R302 over a part of Klipkoppie. This would have implications for the part that would qualify as a conservation area in the end.</i></p> <p><i>"Right now, we're trying to motivate for the R302 to run outside Klipkoppie," explains Ms Terblanche.</i></p> <p><i>"We're soon going to put up boards to make the public aware of Klipkoppie's conservation status but we already want to caution people to stay on the Klipkoppie routes that exist now when they do use them so that we can prevent erosion and other damage."</i></p>

“Om ons gemeenskappe gesond te maak, is soos om 'n legkaart te bou. Elke rolspeeler en gemeenskapslid het 'n rol om te speel om die prentjie volledig te maak. Die vraag is eintlik hoe kry ons mense om saam te werk?

“Swartland Munisipaliteit se sosiale ontwikkelingsbeleid en strategie sien dit as een van die belangrike maniere waarop die plaaslike owerheid 'n verskil in die gemeenskap kan maak. Swartland Munisipaliteit het verskeie programme waardeur hulle beter samewerking en gevolglik beter dienslewering bevorder.” Hier is 'n paar van die huidige projekte:

Thusong Diensleweringssentrum: Die nasionale regering se Thusong-program het in 1999 begin. Thusong is 'n Sotho-woord wat beteken "gee hulp".

Swartland Munisipaliteit bestuur een Thusong-dienssentrum in Ilinge Lethu, maar ondersteun gemeenskapsentrums wat ook regeringsdienste nader aan die gemeenskap bring, soos die Alphastraat-sentrum in Wesbank, Darling Fokus, Futura Moorreesburg en Die Kraaltjie in Kalbaskraal.

Die doel van 'n Thusong-sentrum is om 'n eenstop-dienspunt te wees wat regerings- en ander dienste nader aan gemeenskappe bring, inligting deel en samewerking bevorder.

“Ons het reeds heelwat sukses gehad: Verlede jaar is daar 'n interregeringskomitee gestig wat bestaan uit Swartland Munisipaliteit, SASSA, Departemente Maatskaplike Ontwikkeling, Binnelandse Sake en Arbeid. Deur die komitee is gemeenskapuitreike georganiseer na Riebeek-Wes (629 mense bereik), Darling (894), Moorreesburg/Koringberg (709), Riverlands/Chatsworth/Abbotsdale/Kalbaskraal (208) en Malmesbury (894).

“Dit beteken jy kan nou SASSA besoek en op dieselfde dag sake met Arbeid, die munisipaliteit en Binnelandse Sake uitsorteer binne jou eie gemeenskap. Ander regeringsdienste en NGO's kom ook na die uitreike toe, byvoorbeeld SARS, die Openbare Beskermer en die National Youth Development Agency.

“Vervoer is verskaf waar dorpe saam by een punt bedien is. Die projek maak regeringsdienste baie meer toeganklik en help dat mense so min as moontlik tyd moet afvat van werk om hulle sake uit te sorteer.”

Verskeie Thusong-uitreike word vanjaar beplan: Broodkraal 22 Mei, Riebeek-Wes stadsaal 22 Junie; Moorreesburg Rosenhof 29-30 September; Darling-gemeenskapsaal 31 Augustus -1 September; Goedgedacht Plaas, Riebeekvallei 2 Oktober;

can't be solved simply at the press of a button. It's a little more complicated than that, says Marguerite Holtzhausen, Head of Community Development at the Municipality.

“Healing our communities is like building a jigsaw puzzle. Every stakeholder and community member has a role to play in completing the picture. The question is actually how we get people to work together.

“Swartland Municipality's social development policy and strategy state that this is one of the important ways in which the local authority can make a difference in the community. It has several programmes through which it promotes better cooperation and, as a result, better service delivery.”

Here are a few of these projects:

Thusong Service Delivery Centre: National government's Thusong programme started in 1999. “Thusong” is Sotho for “give help”.

Swartland Municipality manages a Thusong service centre in Ilinge Lethu but it also supports community centres that bring government services closer to the community, such as the Alpha Street Centre in Westbank, Darling Focus, Futura Moorreesburg and Die Kraaltjie in Kalbaskraal.

The aim of a Thusong centre is to act as a one-stop service point that brings government and other services closer to communities, shares information and encourages cooperation.

“We've already had a lot of successes. Last year, for example, an intergovernmental committee was established consisting of Swartland Municipality, SASSA, the Department of Social Development, the Department of Home Affairs and the Department of Labour. The committee organised community outreaches to Riebeek West (where it reached 629 people), Darling (894 people), Moorreesburg and Koringberg (709 people), Riverlands, Chatsworth, Abbotsdale and Kalbaskraal (208 people) and Malmesbury (894 people).

“This means that you can now go to SASSA and – on the same day – also go to Labour, to the Municipality and to Home Affairs to sort out issues in your community. Other government services and NGOs – SARS, the Public Protector, the National Youth Development Agency – also come to the outreaches,” continues Ms Holtzhausen.

“Transport is provided where more than one town is served at the same point. So the project makes government services much more accessible and means that people can take off as little time as possible from work to sort out their affairs.”

More Thusong outreaches are planned for this year: Broodkraal on 22 May; the Riebeek West town hall on 22 June; Rosenhof in Moorreesburg from 29 to 30 September; the Darling community hall from 31 August to 1 September;

Malmesbury llinge Lethu 13 Oktober en Malmesbury Wesbank 14 Oktober.

Swartland Maatskaplike Ontwikkelingsforum: Swartland Munisipaliteit het reeds in 2008 die nood gesien vir beter samewerking tussen rolspelers (regering- en nie-regeringsorganisasies) ten einde sosiale probleme ten opsigte van kinders aan te spreek en te koördineer. Eers is 'n kinderontwikkelingsforum gestig wat in 2013 verander het na die Swartland Social Development Forum (SSDF). Die SSDF word in vennootskap met Departement Maatskaplike Ontwikkeling (DSD) bestuur, met Swartland as die sekretariaat en DSD as die voorsitter.

“Sedert die forum in 2010 begin het, is daar op alle dorpe met Junie-vakansieprogramme begin. Swartland Munisipaliteit dra fondse by tot die programme en het 'n koördineringsfunksie. Plaaslike nie-regeringsorganisasies en regeringsdienste organiseer die projekte op 'n jaarlikse basis op tien dorpe en in twee landelike gebiede.

“Die SSDF is in 2013 deur minister Albert Fritz geloods en vanjaar is die forum besig om na grondvlak te beweeg met uitreike (road shows) in die gemeenskappe. Daar is reeds werkwinkels op Darling en Moorreesburg gehou .

“Vier fokusareas is bepaal: kinderbeskerming, middele misbruik (substance abuse) kinders wat vroeg skool verlaat (school drop outs) en slagoffer bemagtiging (victim empowerment).

Werkwinkels oor die Kinderwet is ook reeds met rolspelers gehou.”

Die uitreike gaan binnekort op die volgende dorpe aangebied word: Malmesbury (15 Mei), Riverlands (16 April) en Chatsworth (23 April). Die doel van die werkwinkels is om drie doelstellings te formuleer vir elke fokusarea wat gesamentlik aangepak gaan word deur die gemeenskap en regering.

Twee afgevaardigdes van die dorp word gekies wat die dorp op die SSDF sal verteenwoordig. Waar moontlik skakel die plaaslike verteenwoordigers in by bestaande gemeenskappolisieringsforums.

Plaaslike Dwelm Aksiekomitee: Volgens die Wet op die Voorkoming en Behandeling van Dwelmafhanglikheid (Wet 70 van 2008), moet munisipaliteite plaaslike dwelmkomitees vorm. Die burgemeester het volgens voorskrifte van die wet in 2013 'n plaaslike dwelmkomitee gestig. Die komitee bestaan uit verskeie regerings- en nie-regeringsorganisasies wat teen dwelmen en alkoholverslawing optree. Die komitee (LDAC) is in die Swartland 'n subkomitee van die SSDF en doen verslag aan die SSDF oor sy bedrywighede.

“Die dwelmkomitee is deur die Departement Maatskaplike Dienste opgelei oor die rol van die komitee, asook die belangrikste aspekte van die dwelmprobleem.

Goedgedacht Farm in Riebeeck Valley on 2 October; llinge Lethu in Malmesbury on 13 October; and Westbank in Malmesbury on 14 October.

Swartland Social Development Forum (SSDF): Swartland Municipality saw the need back in 2008 already for better cooperation between role players (government and non-government organisations) to tackle social problems that involve children and to coordinate solutions. In 2010, a child development forum was established, which, in 2013, became the SSDF and is now run in partnership with the Department of Social Development (DSD), with Swartland as the secretariat and the DSD as the chair.

Says Ms Holtzhausen: “When the forum was started in 2010, June holiday programmes were introduced in all the towns. Swartland Municipality contributes funds to the programmes and it acts as a coordinator. Local non-government organisations and government services organise the programmes; this happens every year in ten towns and in two rural areas.

“Minister Albert Fritz launched the SSDF in 2013 and, this year, it’s moving to grassroots level with outreaches – or road shows – in the communities. Workshops have already been held in Darling and in Moorreesburg.

“Four focus areas have been identified: child protection; substance abuse; school dropouts; and victim empowerment. Workshops about the Children’s Act have also already been held with role-players.”

These workshop outreaches will soon come to the following towns: Malmesbury (on 15 May); Riverlands (on 16 April); and Chatsworth (on 23 April). The purpose of the workshops is to formulate three objectives for each of the four focus areas. This will be done together by the community and government.

Two representatives from each town will be chosen to represent their town on the SSDF. Where possible, these local representatives will link up with existing community police forums.

Local Drug Action Committee (LDAC): In terms of the Prevention of and Treatment for Substance Abuse Act 70 of 2008, municipalities have to form local drug committees. The mayor therefore established such a body in 2013. This committee is made up of various government and non-government organisations that fight drug and alcohol addiction. In the Swartland, the LDAC, as it is known, is a subcommittee of the SSDF and therefore reports to the SSDF about its activities.

“The LDAC was trained by the Department of Social Development about its role and about the most important aspects of the drug problem. The issue of all the role-players working together was also discussed”, says Ms Holtzhausen.

The LDAC is currently reaching out to the community through information-gathering sessions. From this

This is the meaning of Philip Humphreys, Director of Protection Services, and Roman Steyn, Head of Traffic and Law Enforcement. They continued by highlighting some challenges and obstacles in their areas of responsibility:</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • <i>Motorists must remember that robots don’t work during load shedding: “The law is simple,” explained Mr Humphreys. “When a robot is off, the intersection works like a four-way stop: the person who stops first can drive first.”</i> • <i>Alcohol remains a big headache: between 60 and 80% of all accidents in South Africa – and in the Swartland – involve alcohol: “We appeal to motorists not to drink and drive – or then to get a sober person to drive,” Mr Humphreys pleaded.</i> <p><i>He warned people that very strict legislation will soon be in force. “New draft legislation will stipulate that motorists</i></p>

“Ons versoek mense vriendelik om navraag te doen oor moontlike uitstaande boetes. Ons sal probeer help waar ons kan.

“Onthou, as daar uitstaande boetes is, kan ‘n motoris geen transaksies met die departement doen nie: soos om ‘n lisensie te hernu, ensovoorts.”

- ‘n Laaste vermaning gaan oor leerlinglisensies.

Humphreys: “Oneerlikheid betaal nie en ons waarsku mense wat betaal vir antwoordstelle of afskryfnote in die toetslokaal inneem.”

‘n Persoon is onlangs op Moorreesburg op heterdaad betrap: “Ons het die polisie laat kom, die persoon is in hegtenis geneem en van bedrog aangekla.

“Die persoon kan nou sonder ‘n lisensie met ‘n kriminele rekord sit. Dit is nie die moeite werd nie en dit is ook nie waaroor dit gaan nie: ons wil hê ‘n bestuurder moet behoorlik toegerus wees as hy/sy die dag agter ‘n stuurwiel inskuif.”

won't be allowed to drink at all before they drive and there are also going to be limits for passengers and for pedestrians.”

- *Speed kills: “Speed is probably our single biggest problem,” Mr Humphreys continued. “Between December and February, 23 527 speed fines were given in the Swartland – but it doesn't seem as if fines put people off.”*

- *Cell phones and driving don't go together: “The only solution is not to drive and talk on your cell phone at the same time,” Mr Steyn said. “Otherwise your attention just isn't on the road.”*

- *Pay your fines: Mr Steyn warned motorists to pay their fines before the law comes looking for them.*

“With the automatic number plate recognition system, we can see if you have any outstanding fines. The Traffic Department can also show up on your stoep with a warrant.

“We kindly ask people to make enquiries about any possible outstanding fines that they may have. We'll try to help where we can. Remember, if you have outstanding fines, you can't do any transactions with the department – you can't renew your licence and so on.”

- *The final warning is about learner's licences.*

Mr Humphreys: “Dishonesty doesn't pay. People who pay for answer papers or who take crib notes into test venues have now been warned.” Someone was recently caught in the act in Moorreesburg.

“We summoned the police, who took the person into custody and accused him of fraud. He may now sit without a licence and with a criminal record. It's not worth it and it's not what a licence is about: we want drivers to be equipped properly the day that they get behind a steering wheel.”

The traffic department doesn't deal only with vehicles and with people, however: complaints about the keeping of animals also land in their basket.

“This forms part of our challenges. One of the draft bylaws that's now open for comment does, in fact, deal with so-called nuisances.

“Then there are the stray animals, which cause problems especially on the N7. In connection with this, motorists can phone Traffic during office hours at 022 487 4900/9479/9411.
