

## VACANCY: Youth workers: Sondeza Afri –Youth camp: 2024

Opportunity for: 11 Youth Workers . (4 Male + 7 Female)  
Period: 4 – 13 December 2024  
Where: Ganzekraal on the West Coast  
Training: 22 & 23 November 2023 in Malmesbury (compulsory)  
Role: To provide supervision to and manage the youth during the camp  
Closing date for applications: 20 September 2024

The Sondeza Afri-Youth camp is an initiative of Swartland Municipality. It will be held for the 19th year at Ganzekraal, a resort on the West Coast. 50 Grade 10 and 11 learners from secondary schools in the West Coast and international countries will attend the camp.

This may be seen as an ideal opportunity for Education and Social Development students who will start their working careers the following year to gain experience in the development of youth. If it is your passion to work with secondary school children and be involved with leadership development, this advertisement is for you.

The work of the 11 youth workers at the camp may be seen as a voluntary contribution to the community, however they will be paid an allowance of R1 200 each for which they must attend the training and be present for the whole duration of the camp. Free accommodation and meals will be provided to youth workers.

### Requirements:

- Minimum Grade12 qualification with experience in youth work after Grade 12.
- Degree or Diploma in Education, Social Science or youth work will be a recommendation.
- Between the ages of 22 and 28.
- Must be a South African citizen.
- Provide own transport to Malmesbury for the training.
- Physically fit and healthy for participation in outdoor activities.
- Must be able to speak read and write English fluently.
- Previous involvement with youth development and/or community projects or organisations will be a recommendation.
- Attendance of youth worker training in Malmesbury from 23 to 24 November 2024 for preparation of the camp is compulsory.
- Previous attendance of Sondeza youth camps will be a recommendation.
- A **Name Clearance certificate** obtainable from your nearest SAPS office must be handed in with the application or if not available yet, before the camp takes place.

### Candidates will be expected to demonstrate the following skills:

- Leadership and supervision
- Taking responsibility
- Group work and support
- Interpersonal skills
- Co-ordination and taking control
- Adaptability
- Administrative skills
- Facilitating skills
- Reliability and performance of duties

Successful candidates must attend the youth worker training and the camp for the whole duration.
