The new regulations now require SAPS involvement, and there are concerns regarding the Post Office's rescue process and contradictions with the MFMA in the proposed service level agreement.

Die voorsitter lê die maandverslag, soos met die agenda gesirkuleer, ter tafel en die Senior. Bestuurder: Publieke Dienste behandel enkele aspekte uit die maandverslag.

Rdl C Fortuin spreek haar kommer uit oor die swak kommunikasie tydens onlangse wateronderbrekings in Moorreesburg, veral toe 'n waterpyp by die reservoir 'n paar weke gelede gebars het. Sy het die behoefte aan beter koördinerings en kommunikasie tussen die betrokke afdelings en rolspelers beklemtoon en stel voor dat inligting oor sulke voorvalle tydig gedeel word op die bestaande raadslede-groep. Sy versoek verder dat luidsprekervoertuie gebruik word om inwoners in kennis te stel wat nie toegang tot sosiale media het nie.

Die Munisipale Bestuurder verduidelik dat die aanvanklike beoordeling van die wateronderbreking in Moorreesburg was dat dit slegs 'n paar uur sou duur. Toe die watertoevoer egter herstel is, het hoë druk veroorsaak dat die pype weer gebars het, wat tot 'n langer onderbreking gelei het. Hy beklemtoon die belangrikheid van akkurate kommunikasie.

The Chairperson tabled the monthly report, as circulated with the agenda, and the Senior Manager: Public Services addressed certain aspects from the monthly report.

Cllr C Fortuin expressed her concern about the poor communication during recent water interruptions in Moorreesburg, especially when a water pipe at the reservoir burst a few weeks ago. She emphasised the need for better coordination and communication between the relevant departments and role-players and suggests that information about such incidents be shared timeously on the existing councillor group. She further requested that loudspeaker vehicles be used to inform residents who do not have access to social media.

The Municipal Manager explained that the initial assessment of the water interruption in Moorreesburg was that it would only last a few hours. However, when the water supply was restored, high pressure caused the pipes to burst again, which led to a longer interruption. He emphasized the importance of accurate communication.

**REPORT: SWARTLAND WASTE WATER TREATMENT WORKS
(DECEMBER 2025)**

OPERATION OF ACTIVATED SLUDGE TREATMENT WORKS

Below is comments from the consulting chemists with regards to operational matters of the various waste water treatment works.

MALMESBURY (66%)

1. An average daily flow of 5 298 m³/d was recorded in December (53.0% capacity).
2. An organic load of 6 573 kg COD/d was imposed on the plant (65 .7% capacity).
3. The sludge masses were somewhat low in absolute terms for an MBR plant, establishing a sludge age of only 8 days. Maintain 800 – 900 ml/l solids across both aeration units, by judicious sludge wastage.
4. Plant performance was adequate at both aeration tanks with respect to the nitrification of ammonia nitrogen and the removal of organics.
5. The final effluent complied with the General Limit, except for ortho phosphate. Increase the mixed liquor recycles to the anaerobic zone to assist with phosphate removal.
6. Disinfection was good (12 Faecal Coliforms per 100ml).

MOORREESBURG (70%)

1. An average daily flow of 1 337 m³/d was recorded in December (70.4% capacity).
2. An organic load 1 166 kg COD/d was imposed on the plant (61.4% capacity).
3. The sludge masses at both aeration tanks were high in absolute terms. Maintain 200 – 300 ml/l solids, by increasing sludge wastage from both aeration tanks.
4. Plant performance was good across aeration tank No.1, the nitrification of ammonia nitrogen being virtually complete and the removal of organics being adequate. Plant performance varied across aeration tank No.2. The nitrification of ammonia nitrogen was incomplete, possibly due to aeration being inhibited by the high sludge mass. Removal of organics was nonetheless adequate at the latter.
5. Both settling tank effluents were of satisfactory chemical quality.
6. The underflow sludge return rates from both settling tanks were adequate. Increase sludge wastage (Waste Activated Sludge) from settling tank No.1's sludge return sump.
7. The chlorine residuals were slightly high. Maintain 0.25 mg/l free chlorine. Disinfection was complete (<1 Faecal Coliforms per 100ml).
8. The final effluent complied with the General Limit, except for nitrate/nitrite nitrogen and free chlorine.

DARLING (188%)

1. An average daily flow of 1 919 m³/d was recorded in December, far exceeding the hydraulic design capacity (142% capacity).
2. An organic load of 2 936 kg COD/d was imposed on the plant, far exceeding the organic load design capacity (188% capacity).
3. Both aerators serviceable and operating. The sludge mass was marginally low in absolute terms. Maintain 800 -900 ml/l solids, by wasting sludge judiciously.

4. Plant performance remained inadequate in the aeration basin relative to the nitrification of ammonia nitrogen, due to the marginally low sludge mass, low sludge age as well as severe plant overload. Removal of organics was satisfactory, however.
5. The settling tank effluent was of good chemical quality.
6. The underflow sludge return rate was ideal.
7. The final effluent complied with the General Limit, except for free chlorine. Final effluent 2 (reed bed) complied with the Irrigation Limit up to 500 m³, relevant to parameters measured.
8. The chlorine residuals were high. Maintain 0.25mg/l free chlorine. Disinfection was good (3 Faecal Coliforms per 100ml).
9. The Irrigation Limit up to 500 m³, which applies to final effluent 2 (reed bed), does not specify compliance criteria for free chlorine. Disinfection was satisfactory at final effluent 2 (3280 Faecal Coliforms per 100ml).

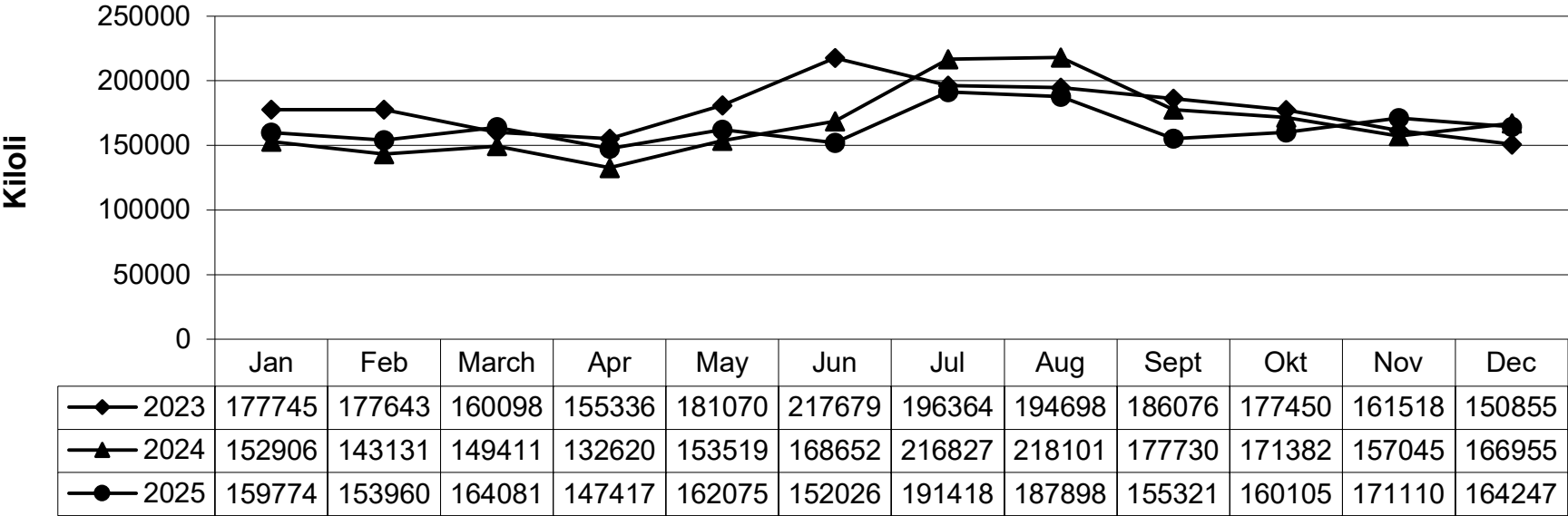
RIEBEEK VALLEI (58%)

1. An average daily flow of 878 m³/d was recorded in December (58.5% capacity).
2. An organic load of 719 kg COD/d was exerted on the plant (47.9% capacity).
3. The sludge mass was slightly low in absolute terms at the aeration tank. Maintain 500 – 600ml/l solids, by judicious sludge wastage.
4. Plant performance was satisfactory in the aeration basin relative to the nitrification of ammonia nitrogen and removal of organics.
5. Both settling tank effluents were of sufficient chemical quality. The underflow sludge return rates were satisfactory.
6. The chlorine residuals were slightly high. Maintain 0.25mg/l free chlorine. Disinfection was complete (<1 Faecal Coliforms per 100ml).
7. The final effluent complied with the General Limit.

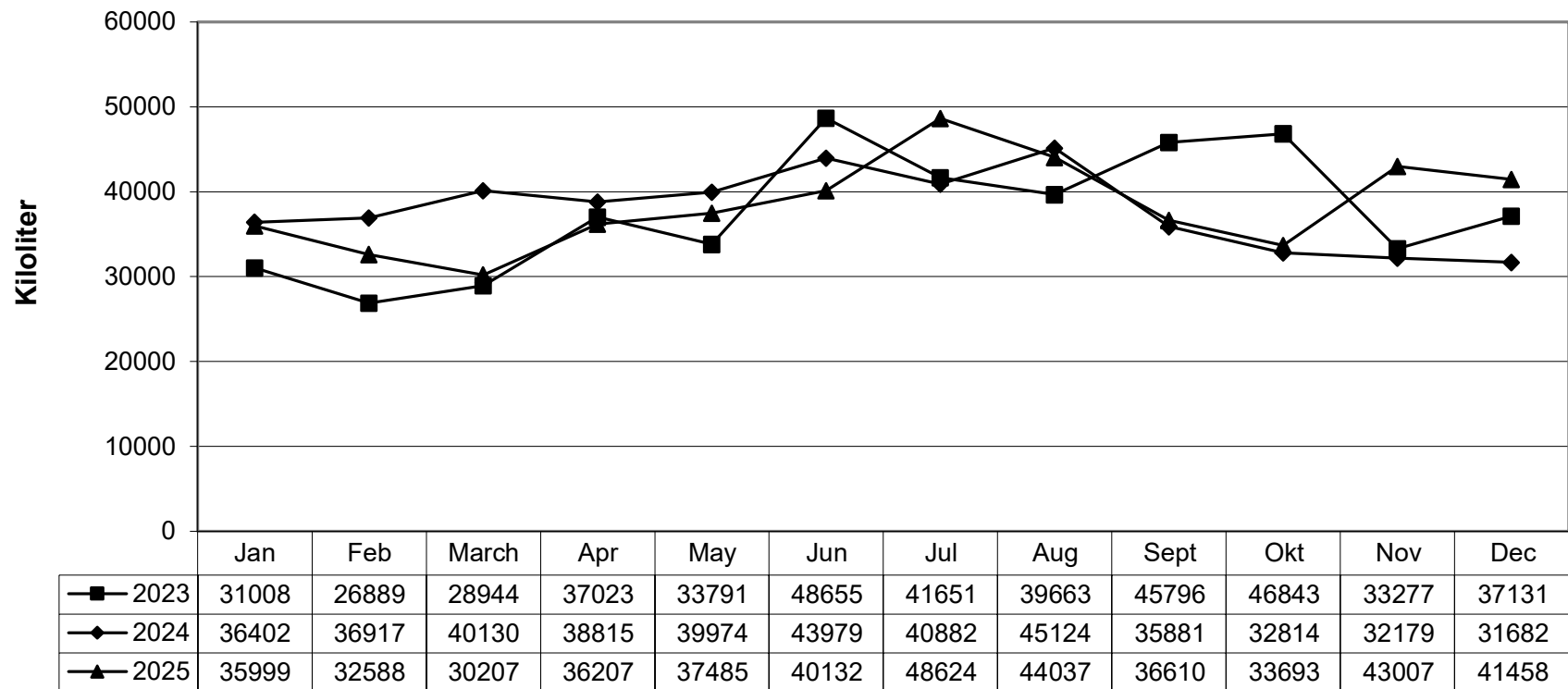
Malmesbury WWTW Effluent 2023 - 2025

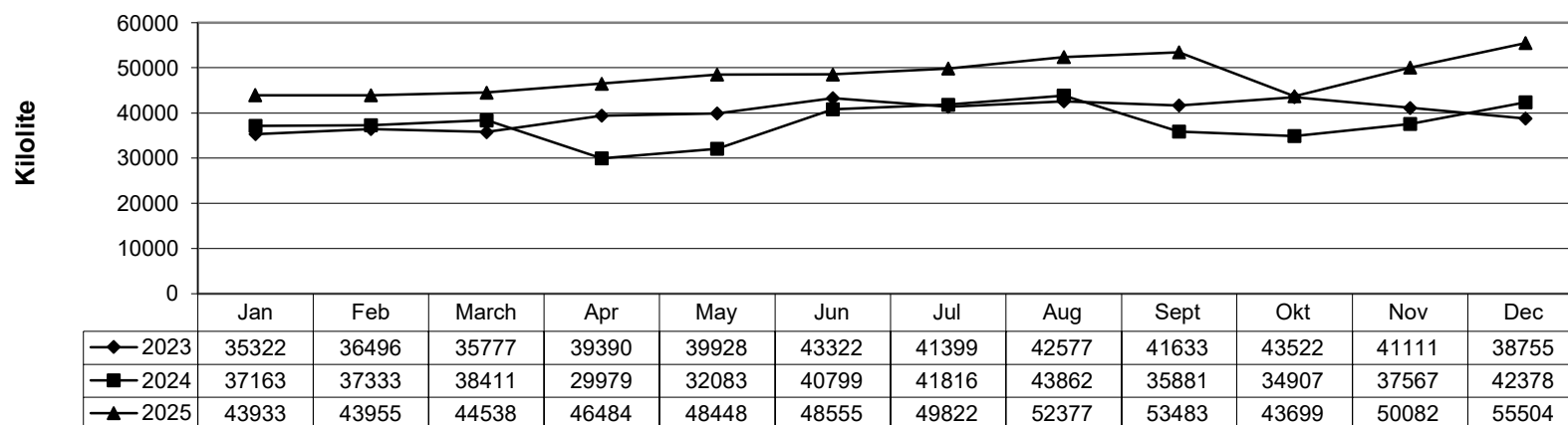
Moorreesburg WWTW Effluent 2023 - 2025

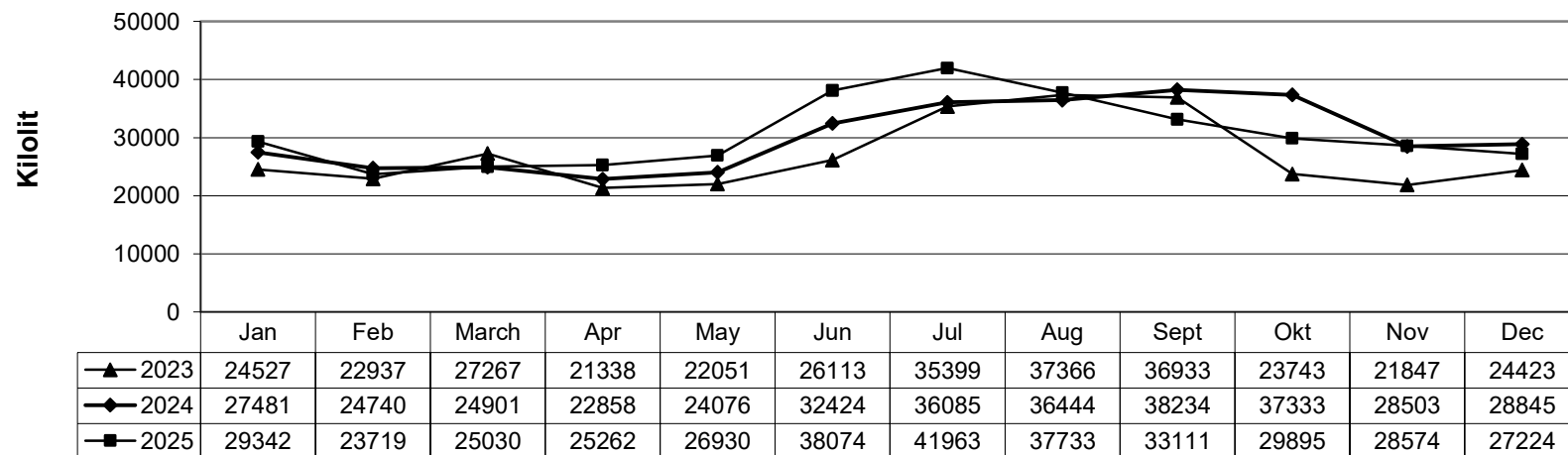
Darling WWTW Effluent 2023 - 2025

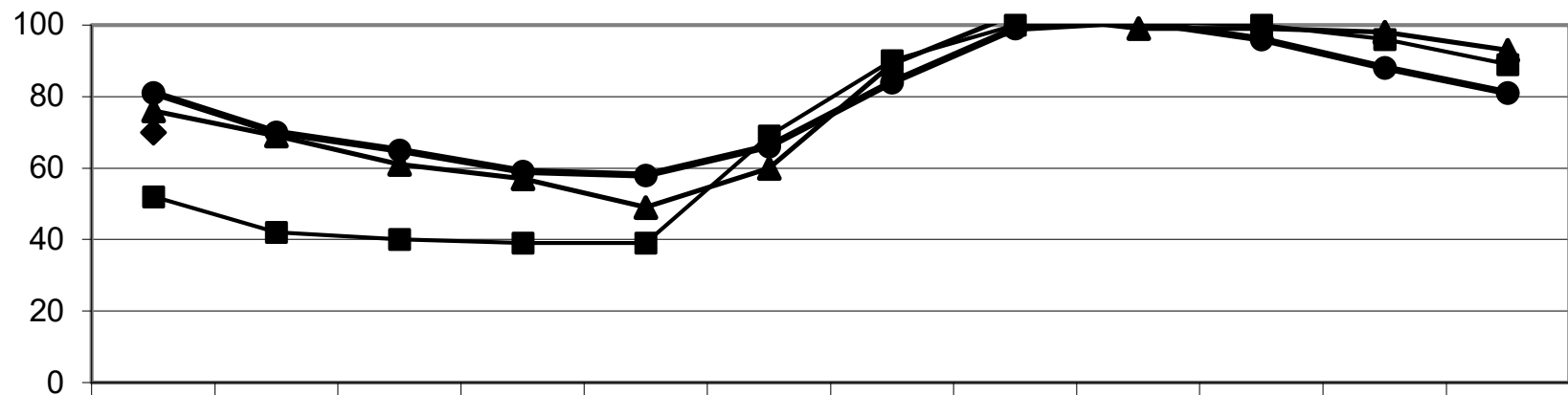
Riebeek Valley WWTW Effluent 2023 - 2025

Voëlvlei Dam Storage 2023 - 2026

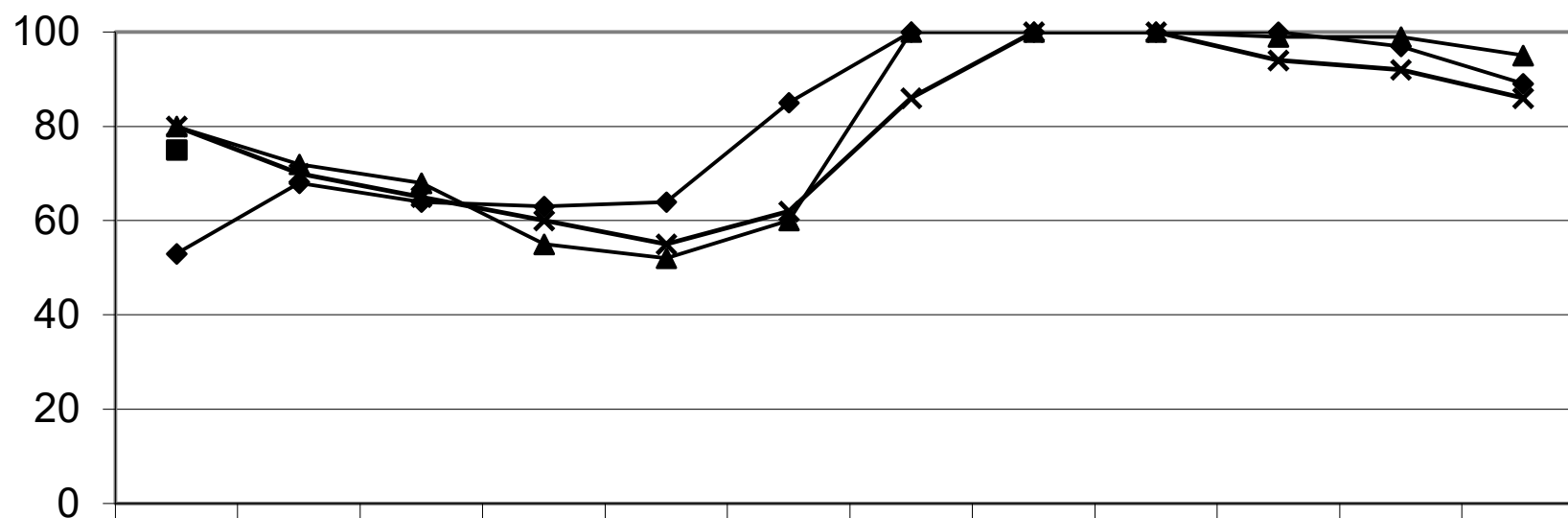

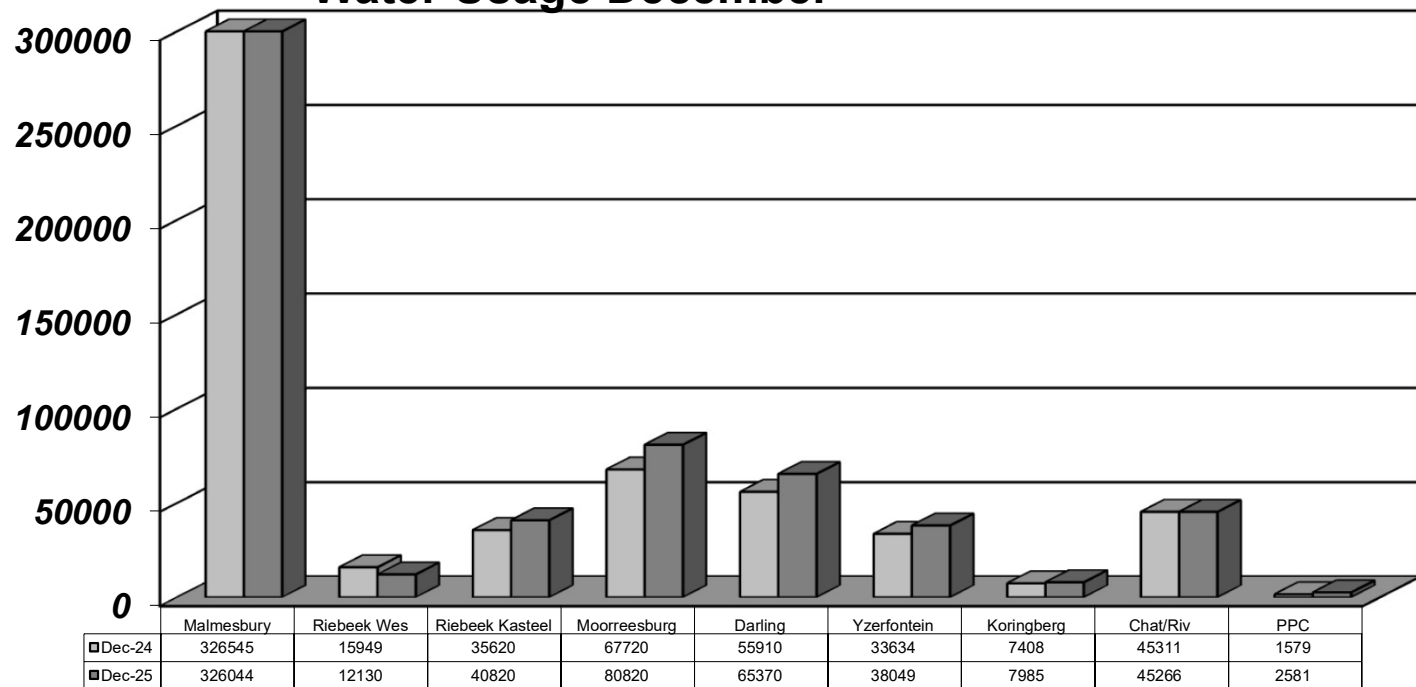

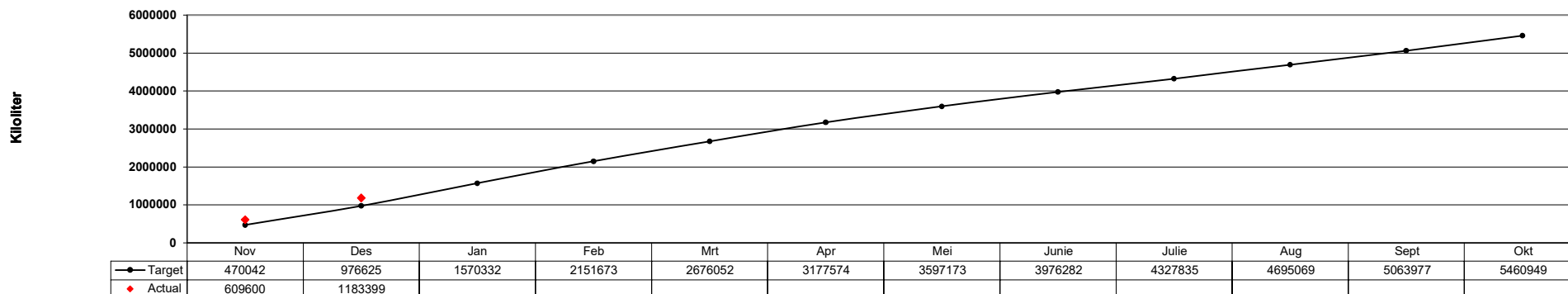

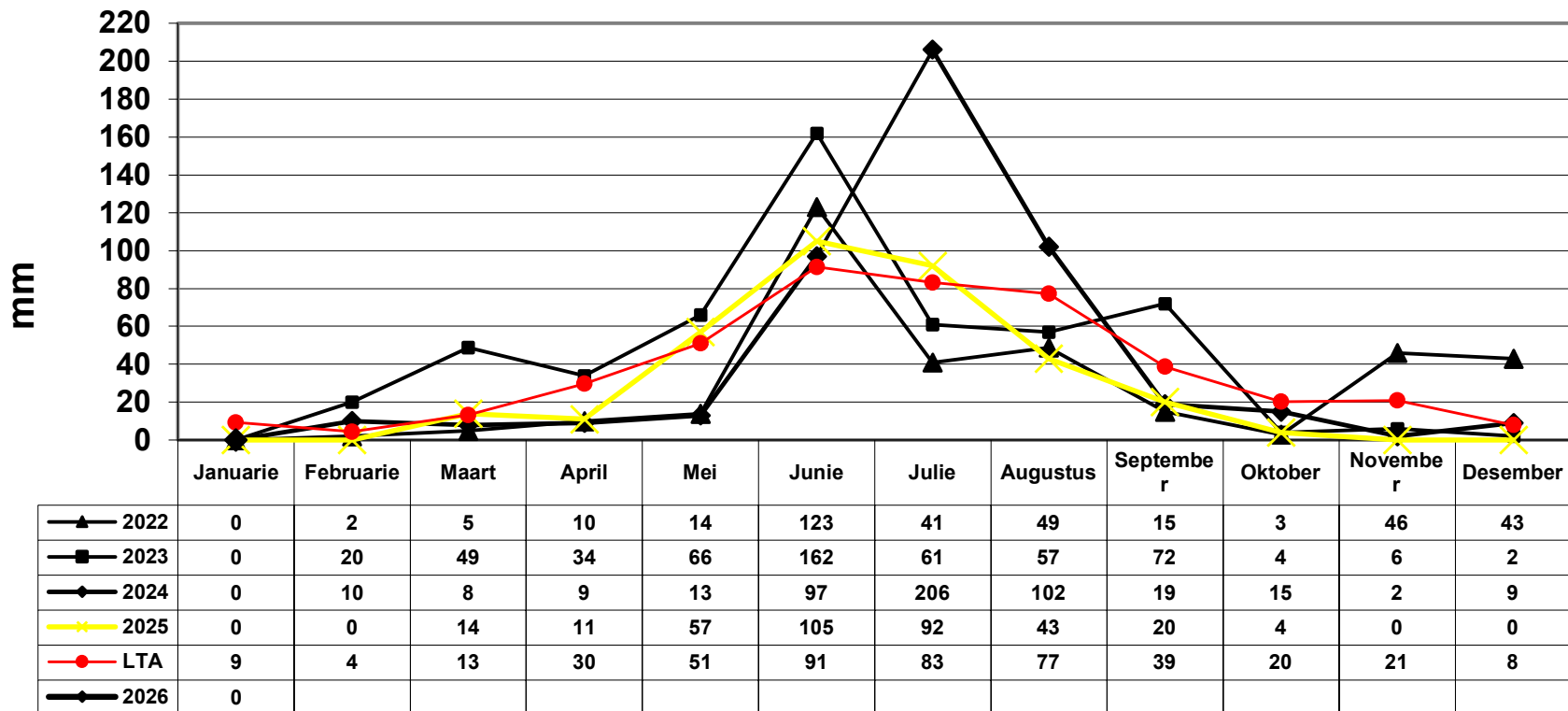


Water Usage: Target vs Actual Graph 5.2



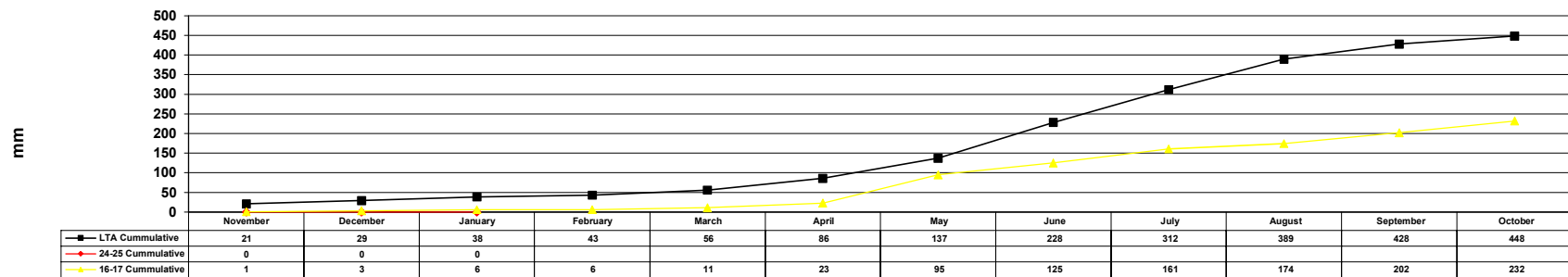
Rainfall 2022 - 2026

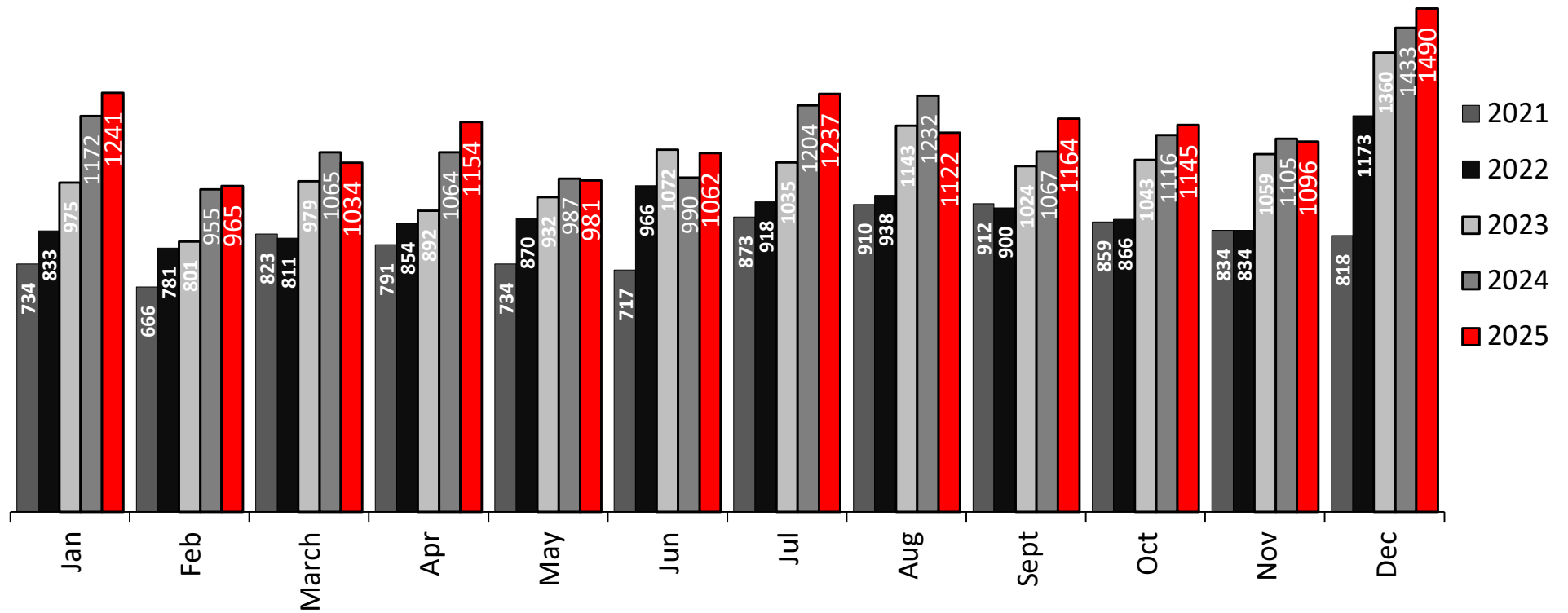


Cumulative Rainfall

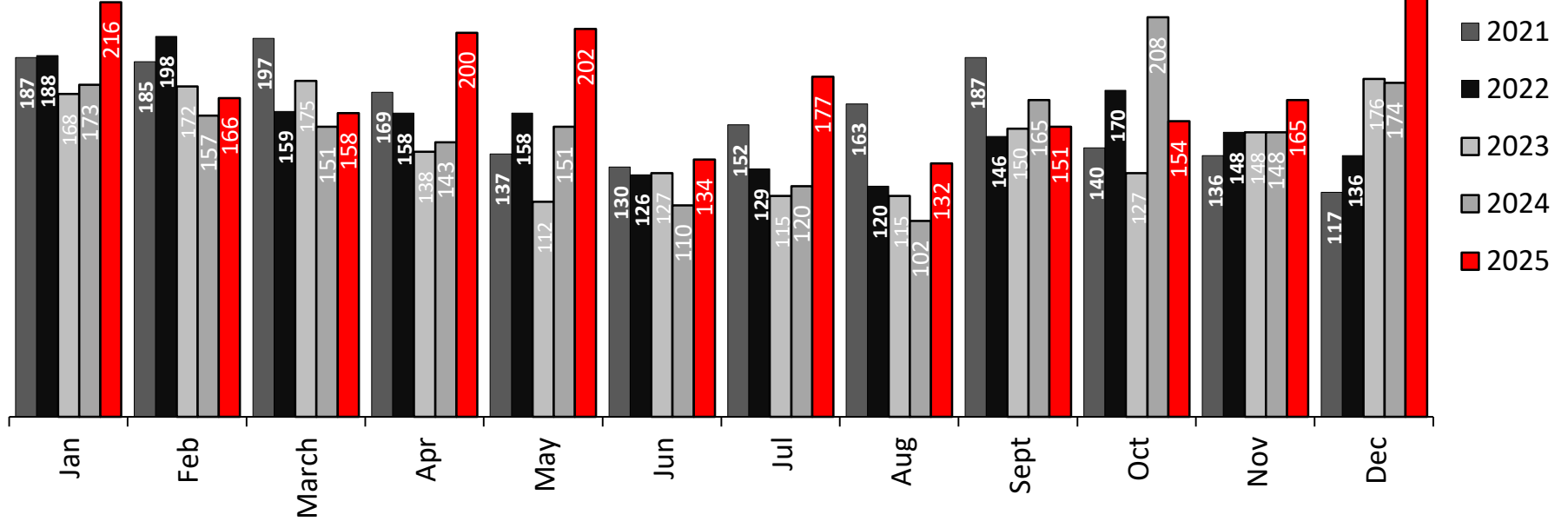

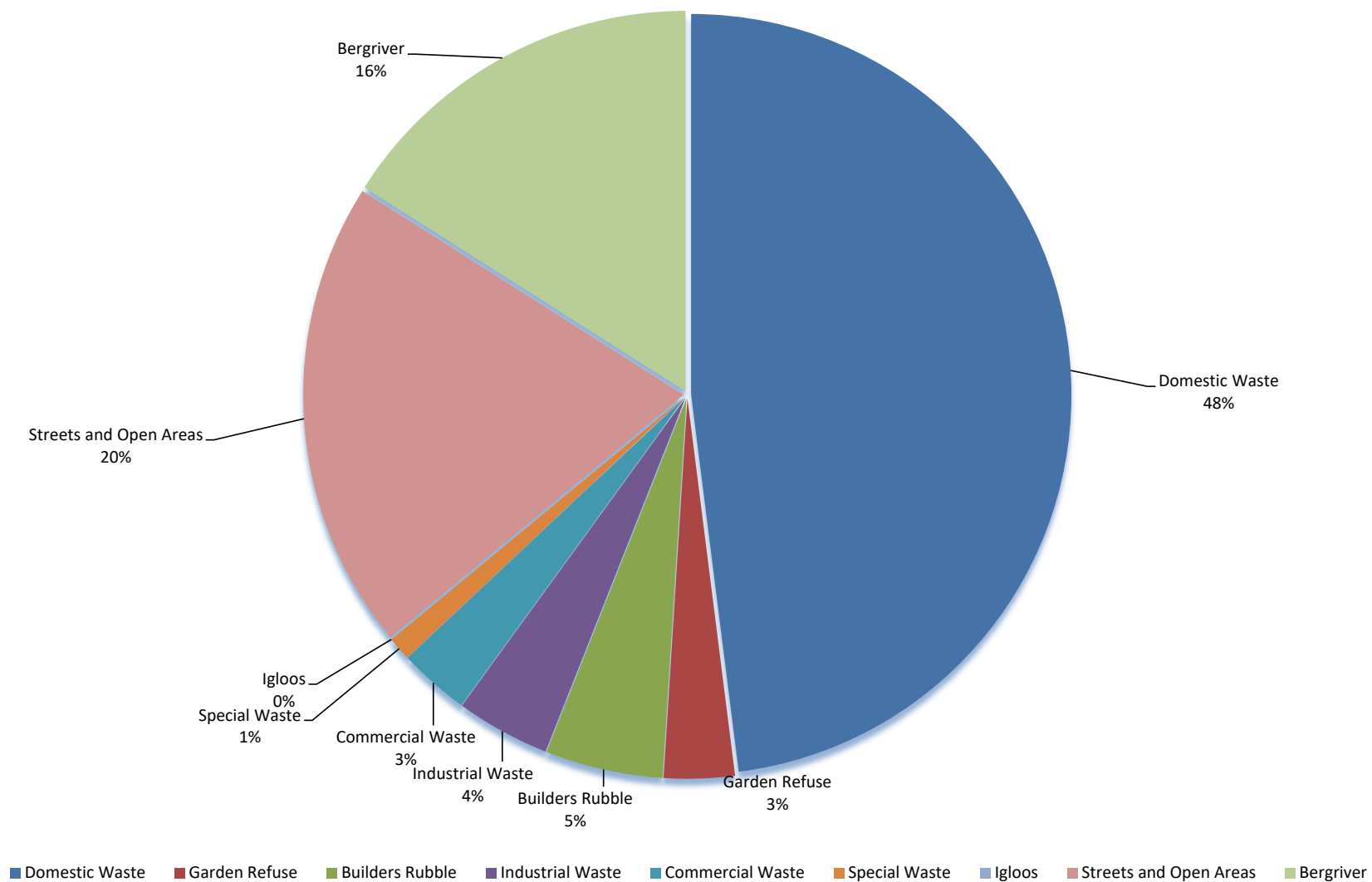

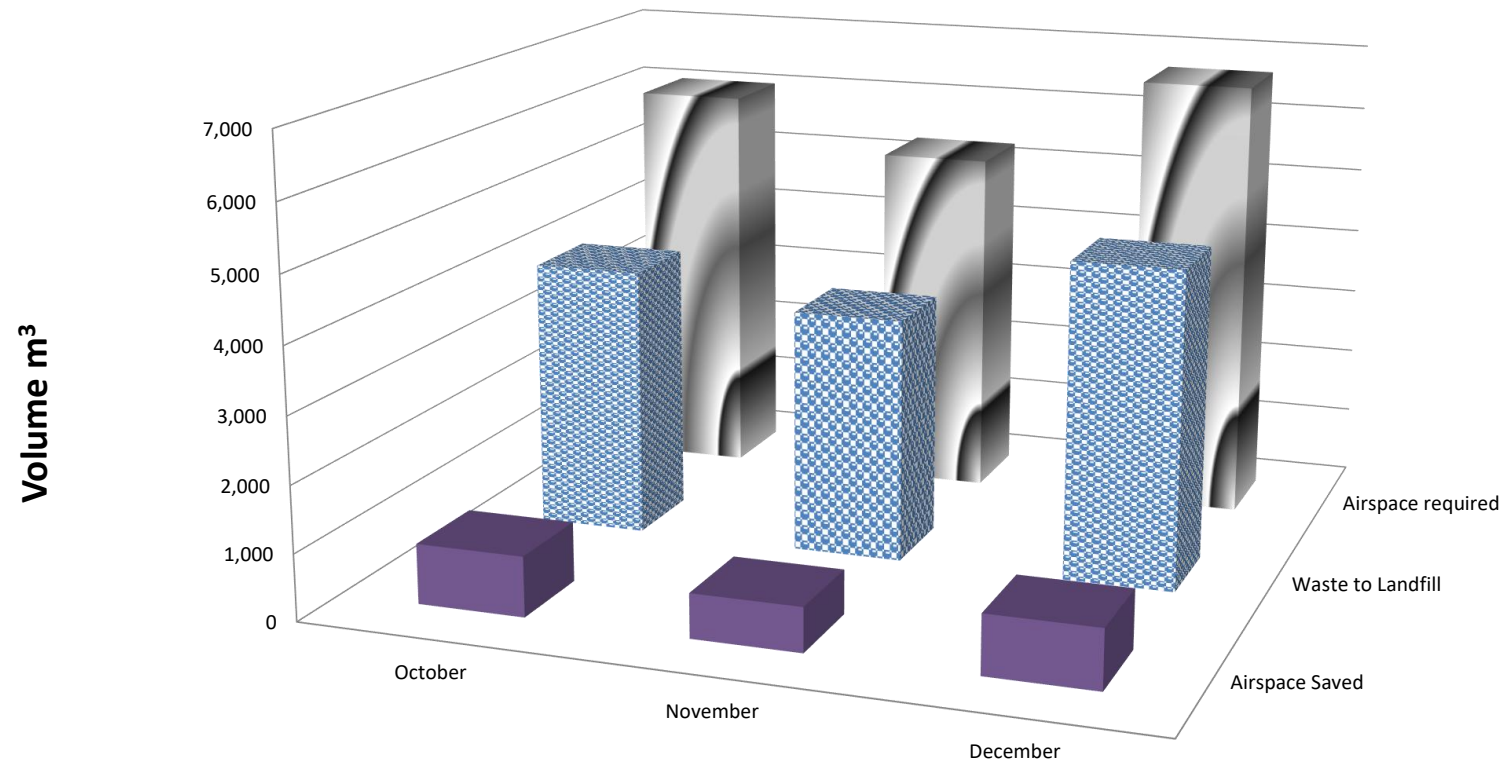

3. SUBMISSIONS/DEPUTATIONS/COMMUNICATIONS

3.1 AWARENESS ON GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE (GBV)

The Director: Development Services addressed Council on the ongoing problem of Gender-Based Violence (GBV) in South Africa. She emphasised that this problem is widespread in local communities, with assaults, murders and harm to children occurring regularly.

She stated that an information pack has been provided to all councillors, which includes important statistics, among others that every 2.5 hours a woman is murdered as a result of GBV, and that approximately one in three women experience physical violence during their lifetime.

The Director: Development Services urged Council to reflect on and honour the victims, especially since the December–January period is a time when families are more vulnerable. She suggested that a candle be lit in remembrance of those who lost their lives due to GBV.

5.1 MAANDVERSLAG: SEPTEMBER 2025

Die Direkteur: Ontwikkelingsdienste behandel die maandverslag van die Direktoraat: Ontwikkelingsdienste vir September 2025, met spesifieke verwysing na vordering met die onderskeie behuisingsprojekte.

Rdd J M de Beer versoek of daar vordering is met die merking van diere. Die Direkteur: Ontwikkelingsdienste meld dat die kleinboere aansoek gedoen het en wag op registrasie van Pretoria. Sy bevestig dat die aansoeke deur die Departement van Landbou gehelp is.

Rdh M A Rangasamy versoek dat strukture by die huidige terrein gesloop word om herbesetting te voorkom. Die Direkteur: Ontwikkelingsdienste bevestig dat dit saam met die betrokke departemente beplan word.

Rdd J M de Beer wys op toenemende getalle varke ondanks kwarantyn. Die Direkteur: Beskermingsdienste verduidelik dat Wetstoepassing daaglik monitor en dat daar 89 varke is. Die Munisipale Bestuurder beklemtoon dat, alhoewel dit nie 'n munisipale bevoegdheid is nie, die saak wel die munisipaliteit raak en dat streng optrede en beplanning vir herhuisvesting nodig is. Rdd J M de Beer meld dat die munisipaliteit as grondeienaar verantwoordelik is om kwarantynreëls af te dwing.

Rdl M Ngozi stel voor dat 'n bewusmakingsveldtog m.b.t Geslagsgebaseerde Geweld (GBV) in alle dorpe gehou word. Die Direkteur: Ontwikkelingsdienste verduidelik dat GBV ambassadeurs gedurende die 16 Dae van Aktivisme bewusmaking sal doen en dat aktiwiteite vanaf 25 November sal begin.

Rdl M Ngozi vra of kleinboere hul materiaal mag saamneem na Tygerfontein. Die Direkteur: Ontwikkelingsdienste meld dat boere self verantwoordelik is vir hul heinings en materiaal en dit kan hergebruik indien in goeie toestand. Sy bevestig verder dat onbenutte strukture na die kwarantyn gesloop sal word, aangesien die grond teen Februarie 2026 vir die De Hoop Behuisingsprojek benodig word.

Op navraag deur rdl D G Bess of die munisipaliteit *solar geysers* by nuwe topstrukture kan voorsien, meld die Direkteur: Ontwikkelingsdienste dat die huidige behuisingssubsidie nie voorsiening maak vir *solar geysers* of warmwaterstelsels nie. Sy voeg by dat die nuwe huise van goeie gehalte is met 'n groot verbetering in lewensomstandighede vir begunstigdes.

Rdd J M de Beer verwys na die aangestelde diensverskaffer wat begunstigdesbriewe versprei vir behuisingssubsidie-aansoeke. Sy waarsku dat individue wat hierdie briewe in die gemeenskap versprei, moontlik politieke voordeel daaruit trek. Sy stel voor dat verspreiding eerder deur die munisipale behuisingskomitee of gemagtigde amptenare geskied. Die Direkteur: Ontwikkelingsdienste verduidelik dat, weens beperkte kapasiteit en drie gelyktydige behuisingsprojekte, eksterne fasiliteerders gebruik is. Sy onderneem om die proses te herevalueer om billike en deursigtige verspreiding te verseker.

5. DELEGATED MATTERS

5.1 MONTHLY REPORT: SEPTEMBER 2025

The Director: Development Services presented the monthly report of the Directorate: Development Services for September 2025, with specific reference to progress with the various housing projects.

Ald J M de Beer asked whether there has been progress with the marking of animals. The Director: Development Services stated that the small-scale farmers have applied and are awaiting registration from Pretoria. She confirmed that the applications were assisted by the Department of Agriculture.

Cllr M A Rangasamy requested that structures at the current site be demolished to prevent reoccupation. The Director: Development Services confirmed that this is being planned with the relevant departments.

Ald J M de Beer noted increasing numbers of pigs despite quarantine. The Director: Protection Services explained that Law Enforcement monitors daily and that there are 89 pigs. The Municipal Manager stated that although this is not a municipal mandate, the matter does affect the municipality and that strict action and planning for relocation are required. Ald J M de Beer stated that the municipality, as the landowner, is responsible for enforcing quarantine rules.

Cllr M Ngozi suggested that an awareness campaign regarding Gender-Based Violence (GBV) be held in all towns. The Director: Development Services explained that GBV ambassadors will conduct awareness during the 16 Days of Activism and that activities will start from 25 November.

Cllr M Ngozi asked whether small-scale farmers may take their materials with them to Tygerfontein. The Director: Development Services stated that farmers are responsible for their own fencing and materials, and these may be reused if in good condition. She further confirmed that unused structures will be demolished after quarantine, as the land is needed for the De Hoop Housing Project by February 2026.

In response to a question from Cllr D G Bess regarding whether the municipality can provide solar geysers for new top structures, the Director: Development Services stated that the current housing subsidy does not make provision for solar geysers or hot water systems. She added that the new houses are of good quality with a significant improvement in living conditions for beneficiaries.

Ald J M de Beer referred to the appointed service provider that distributes beneficiary letters for housing subsidy applications. She warned that individuals distributing these letters in the community may be gaining political advantage. She suggested that distribution should instead be done by the municipal housing committee or authorised officials. The Director: Development Services explained that, due to limited capacity and three concurrent housing projects, external facilitators were used. She undertook to re-evaluate the process to ensure fair and transparent distribution.

Dahlia Centre: GBVF Focus

There is a growing need to support victims of gender-based and domestic violence in the Swartland Municipal area. In response, the municipality are focussing on a preventative programme and already appointed Gender Based Violence (GBV) Ambassadors in all the wards. These ambassadors work closely with government departments, community stakeholders, and private organisations to ensure victims receive the support they need.

Through a series of community engagement sessions, concerns were raised around domestic violence, harassment, alcohol abuse, and general safety. From these discussions, a clear need emerged: the establishment of an accessible, safe space where victims could find immediate support and counselling.

The primary goal of this safe space is to assist individuals and families who have experienced any form of violence, especially gender-based and domestic abuse. It offers a safe, supportive environment where victims can begin to regain control over their lives, build resilience, and feel empowered to move forward.

The Dahlia Centre, is a municipal property located in Wesbank, Malmesbury, near Ilingeletu. The building is being transformed into a welcoming, first point of contact for victims—offering access to essential services such as social support, healthcare, and law enforcement when needed.

The facility will be managed by a Swartland Municipality employee, qualified as a social worker. In addition, the aim is to appoint two suitable workers from the Expanded public works programme (EPWP) to serve as assistants, further supporting the social worker and contributing to the day-to-day operations of the facility.

6. MATTERS FOR CONSIDERATION

6.1 PROPOSED REZONING, SUBDIVISION, CONSOLIDATION AND CLOSURE OF A PUBLIC PLACE OF ERVEN 326, 327, 2244, 2267 AND 2106, RIEBEEK WEST

Mr H Olivier gave background to the application received and mentioned that a request was received from Group 35 (Pty) Ltd to acquire the adjacent land to their property from the

Municipality for the expansion of their business. The council granted approval, subject to conditions, for the alienation of portions of Erven 2244 and 2267, Riebeek West to Group 35 (Pty) Ltd for consolidation with Erf 2106.

The expansion included building of new silos for the existing flour mill, establishing an extrusion plant, constructing a storage warehouse and setting up a bakery. After various interactions with the Division Town Planning and Department Civil Engineering services on concerns, among other, the requirement to provide engineering reports, traffic impact studies, inconsistency with the provisions of the Industrial Zone 1 zoning, etc. the application was amended to limit the proposal to the development of a new storage warehouse only.

RESOLUTION

- A. The application for rezoning of erven 326, 327, 2244 and 2267 from Open Space Zone 1 and Transport Zone 2 respectively to Sub divisional Area be approved in terms of Section 70 of Swartland Municipality: Municipal Land Use Planning By-Law (PG 8226 of 25 March 2020) in accordance with Subdivision Plan Ref RW/13808/RP dated April 2024;
- B. The application for the subdivision of erven 326, 327, 2244 and 2267, Riebeek West be approved in terms of Section 70 of Swartland Municipality: Municipal Land Use Planning By-Law (PG 8226 of 25 March 2020) in accordance with Subdivision Plan Ref RW/13808/RP dated April 2024;
- C. The application for consolidation of portions A, B, C & D with erf 2106, Riebeek West, be approved in terms of Section 70 of Swartland Municipality: Municipal Land Use Planning By-Law (PG 8226 of 25 March 2020) in accordance with Consolidation Plan Ref RW/13808/RP dated April 2024;
- D. The application for closure of public places portions A, B, C & D be approved in terms of Section 70 of Swartland Municipality: Municipal Land Use Planning By-Law (PG 8226 of 25 March 2020);
- E. The decisions A, B, C and D above are subject to the following conditions:

E1 TOWN PLANNING AND BUILDING CONTROL

- (a) The subdivisional area allows for the following zoning categories:
 - (i). Erf 326 – Industrial Zone 1 (1948m² in extent) and Transport Zone 2 (28 836m² in extent);
 - (ii). Erf 327 – Industrial Zone 1 (61m² in extent) and Transport Zone 2 (74 314m² in extent);
 - (iii). Erf 2244 – Industrial Zone 1 (4528m² in extent) and Open Space Zone 1 (5512m² in extent);
 - (iv). Erf 2267 – Industrial Zone 1 (3375m² in extent) and Open Space Zone 1 (7864m² in extent);
- (b) The subject properties be subdivided as follows:
 - (i). Erf 2244 – (10 040m² in extent) into a remainder (5512m² in extent) and portion A (4528m² in extent);
 - (ii). Erf 2267 – (11 239m² in extent) into a remainder (7864m² in extent) and portion B (3375m² in extent);
 - (iii). Erf 326 – (30 784m² in extent) into a remainder (28 836m² in extent) and portion C (1948m² in extent);
 - (iv). Erf 327 – (74 375m² in extent) into a remainder (74 314m² in extent) and portion D (61m² in extent);
- (c) The portions of public place be closed as follows:
 - (i). Portion A (4528m² in extent) of erf 2244 (park);
 - (ii). Portion B (3375m² in extent) of erf 2267 (park);
 - (iii). Portion C (1948m² in extent) of erf 326 (street);
 - (iv). Portion D (61m² in extent) of erf 327 (street);
- (d) Portions A, B, C and D be consolidated with erf 2106 to create one large erf 0 ±21 154m² in extent;
- (e) Building plans to be submitted to the Senior Manager: Development Management for consideration and approval;

E2 WATER

- (a) The consolidated erf be provided with a single water connection;

E3 SEWERAGE

- (a) The consolidated erf be provided with a single sewer connection;

E4 STREETS AND STORMWATER

- (a) Access may not be taken to or from Conniffe January Street, therefore access to the consolidated erf may only be taken to and from the existing access of Rudie du Plooy Street via Station Road. It is therefore required that the applicant install a barricade, to the satisfaction of the Director Civil Engineering Services, between the road reserve of Conniffe January Street and the consolidated property.
- (b) The parking areas be built to a permanent surface standard. An engineer appropriately registered in terms of the provisions of Act 46 of 2000 be appointed by the developer to design the parking areas. The design be submitted to the Director: Civil Engineering Services for approval after which the construction work be carried out under the supervision of the Engineer;
- (c) The development be provided with an internal storm water network which ensures that the runoff, after the development is completed, is the same as before the development. An engineer appropriately registered in terms of the provisions of Act 46 of 2000 be appointed by the developer to design the storm water network. The design be submitted to the Director: Civil Engineering Services for approval after which the construction work be carried out under the supervision of the Engineer;
- (d) As contained in the land acquisition requirements the storm water network via Long Street be formalised. An engineer appropriately registered in terms of the provisions of Act 46 of 2000 be appointed by the developer to design the necessary upgrade. The design be submitted to the Director: Civil Engineering Services for approval after which the construction work be carried out under the supervision of the Engineer;

E5 DEVELOPMENT CHARGES

- (a) The relevant development charges be calculated on building plan stage;

E6 GENERAL

- (a) Cognisance be taken of the contents of the letter from ESKOM dated 3 July 2024 with reference no. 15140-24. The applicant therefore should apply for the applicable working permit before any construction commence;
- (b) The legal certificate which authorises the transfer of the subdivided portions and the consolidated erf in terms of section 38 of the By-Law, will not be issued unless all the relevant conditions have been complied with;
- (c) Should it be determined necessary to expand or relocate any of the engineering services to provide the development with connections, said expansion and/or relocation will be for the cost of the owner/developer;
- (d) The approval does not exempt the applicant from adherence to any and all other legal procedures, applications and/or approvals related to the intended land use, as required by provincial, state, parastatal and other statutory bodies;
- (e) The approval is, in terms of section 76(2)(w) of the By-Law, valid for 5 years. All conditions of approval must be implemented within these 5 years, without which, the approval will lapse. Should all the conditions of approval be met before the 5-year approval period lapses, the subdivision will be permanent and the approval period will not be applicable anymore.
- (f) The applicant/objectors be informed of the right to appeal against the decision of the Municipal Planning Tribunal in terms of section 89 of the By-Law. Appeals be directed, in writing, to the Municipal Manager, Swartland Municipality, Private Bag X52, Malmesbury, 7299 or by e-mail to swartlandmun@swartland.org.za, within 21 days of notification of the decision. An appeal is to comply with section 90 of the By-Law and be accompanied by a fee of R5000-00 to be valid. Appeals that are received late and/or do not comply with the requirements, will be considered invalid and will not be processed.

F. The application be supported for the following reasons:

- (a) The proposed development is consistent with the Swartland MSDF, 2025;
- (b) The development is located within the urban edge and aligns with the land use proposal Zone B designated for industrial use;
- (c) The application supports the matters referred to in SPLUMA as well as the land development principles contained in LUPA;
- (d) The proposal supports the strategic goals for economic transformation, the optimisation of space and infrastructure within the urban edge, as well as community upliftment through job creation. It is therefore aligned with the Swartland IDP, 2025;
- (e) The proposal aligns with local, district as well as Provincial Spatial Development Frameworks, promoting a compact, integrated, and economically vibrant settlement;
- (f) The proposal will contribute to local economic development through job creation in the short and long term;
- (g) It supports agriculture and agri-processing enhancing the economic resilience of Riebeek West contributing not only to the character of the town but also to food security and affordability;
- (h) The expansion and future plans deepen the applicant's commitment to Riebeek West and contributes to long term socio economic development;
- (i) Vacant municipal land is proposed to be consolidated with an existing industrial erf, maximizing functionality as well as contributing to the value of land;
- (j) As proposed development will have a minimal impact on existing infrastructure and any potential upgrading will be for the developers account;
- (k) The proposal still ensures a buffer of between 30m and 55m between residential areas and the proposed expansion mitigating potential noise and environmental impacts;
- (l) The amended proposal complies with the objective and parameters of the Industrial Zone 1 zoning, future phases will be subject to its own land use and public participation processes;
- (m) Access to Conniffe January Street is prohibited as contained in the conditions of approval the amended proposal will have a minimal impact on the neighbouring residential area.

6.2 PROPOSED REZONING, SUBDIVISION AND CONSOLIDATION OF ERVEN 3986 AND 7841, RIVERLANDS (15/3/3-13, 15/3/6-13, 15/3/12-13)

Mr H Olivier provided an overview of the history of Erven 3986 and 7841, Erf 3986 being a so called "black dot" erven in the Greater Chatsworth (Riverlands) surrounded by Erf 7841 which is zoned as Open Space Zone 1 and owned by the Municipality.

It was the intention of the Municipality to acquire Erf 3986 to enable consolidated management of both erven. However, during a public auction of Erf 3986 in 2024 the erf was sold into private ownership.

Given the impractical layout of Erf 3986 surrounded by Erf 7841, the Municipality proposed a realignment of erf boundaries to create two functional properties, namely

- Property 1 (±2623 m²): To be rezoned to Community Zone 3 and allocated to the municipality for community facilities.
- Property 2 (±2422 m²): To be rezoned to Business Zone 2 and allocated to Mr. Leon to accommodate shops.

Therefore, an application was received for the rezoning, subdivision and consolidation of Erven 3986 and 7841 in Greater Chatsworth (Riverlands) to rectify the irregular cadastral layout and unlock the development potential of the said properties.

RESOLUTION

- A. The application for rezoning of Erven 3986 and 7841, Riverlands from Open Space Zone 1 to Subdivisional area be approved in terms of Section 70 of the Swartland Municipality: Municipal Land Use Planning By-Law (PG 8226 of 25 March 2020);

- B. The application for subdivision of Erven 3986 and 7841 be approved in terms of Section 70 of the Swartland Municipality: Municipal Land Use Planning By-Law (PG 8226 of 25 March 2020);
- C. The application for consolidation of Erven 3986 and 7841, Riverlands be approved in terms of Section 70 of the Swartland Municipality: Municipal Land Use Planning By-Law (PG 8226 of 25 March 2020);
- D. The decisions A, B and C above are subject to the conditions:

D1 TOWN PLANNING AND BUILDING CONTROL

- (a) The rezoning be restricted to make provision for the following land uses namely;
 - (i). Community zone 3 (2632m²)
 - (ii). Business zone 2 (2422m²)
- (b) The subdivision be restricted to erf 3986 (1983m² in extent) being subdivided in a remainder (1104m² in extent) and a Portion A (879m² in extent) as well as erf 7841 (3062m² in extent) being subdivided in a remainder (1744m² in extent) and Portion A (1318m² in extent);
- (c) The consolidation be restricted to the consolidation of portion A (portion of Erf 3986) with the remainder of Erf 7841 (2623m² in extent) zoned as community zone 3 as well as portion A (portion of Erf 7841) being consolidated with the remainder of Erf 3986 (2422m² in extent) zoned as Business Zone 2;
- (d) The proposed Business Zone 2 property be developed in accordance with the site development plan presented in the application;

D2 WATER

- (a) Each subdivided portion be provided with its own water connection. This condition is applicable on building plan stage;

D3 SEWERAGE

- (a) Each subdivided portion be provided with its own sewer connection. This condition is applicable on building plan stage;

D4 STREETS AND STORM WATER

- (a) The proposed parking spaces as well as the area between the sidewalk and the surface of the road be provided with a permanent dust free surface being concrete, paving or tar or a material pre-approved by the Municipality and constructed to the satisfaction of the Director: Civil Engineering Services;

D5 DEVELOPMENT CHARGES

- (a) Development charges for the proposed shops be calculated at building plan stage;

E. GENERAL

- (a) If the extension of existing services should be necessary in order to provide the subdivided portion of service connections it will be at the cost of the applicant;
- (b) The approval is, in terms of section 76(2) (w) of the By-Law, valid for a period of 5 years. All conditions of approval be complied with before occupancy certificate be issued and failing to do so may result in administrative action;
- (c) The approval does not exempt the applicant from obtaining any necessary approval from any other applicable statutory authority;
- (d) The applicant/objectors be informed of the right to appeal against this decision of the Municipal Planning Tribunal, within 21 days of this notice, in terms of section 89(2) of the By-Law;

F. The application be supported for the following reasons:

- (a) There are no physical restrictions on the property that will have a negative impact on this application;
- (b) There are no restrictions registered against the title deeds of the properties that prohibits the proposed application;

6.2/F...

- (c) The surveyor general confirmed that both properties are ordinary properties and therefore not deemed public open space;
- (d) Being situated within the town it is clear that although the property is in close proximity to the Riverlands Nature Reserve, due to fragmentation as well as lack of proper protection the property is now of little to no conservation value. Sustainable development is based on 3 key concepts, including Environmental, Economic and Social sustainability. In this specific case and due to the fragmented location of the property from any other area that is of conservation value as well as the fact that it has been heavily disrupted over the past 27 years, the economic and social benefit far outweighs any environmental benefit that may be left;
- (e) The proposed application is consistent with and not in contradiction to the Spatial Development Frameworks adopted on Provincial, District and Municipal levels as discussed above;
- (f) The proposed application will not have a negative impact on the character of the area;
- (g) Mixed use is supported along activity streets;
- (h) The proposed development is not perceived to have a detrimental impact on the health and safety of surrounding landowners, nor will it negatively impact on environmental / heritage assets.

6.3 PROPOSED CONSENT USE ON ERF 73, ABBOTSDALE (15/3/10-1)

Mr A J Burger mentioned the application received for a consent use on Erf 73, Abbotsdale for the operation of a house shop.

Mr Burger confirmed that, in accordance with the legislation and policy frameworks, the proposed house shop is in contradiction with the spatial planning of Abbotsdale as business uses are restricted to activity streets/corridors.

Mr Rabie confirmed that no site specific circumstances were motivated by the applicant and therefore the application is deemed undesirable.

RESOLUTION

- A. The application for a consent use on Erf 73, Abbotsdale, be refused in terms of section 70 of the Swartland Municipality: Municipal Land Use Planning By-Law (PG 8226 of 25 March 2020);
- B. **GENERAL**
 - (a) Appeals against the decision should be directed, in writing, to the Municipal Manager, Swartland Municipality, Private Bag X52, Malmesbury, 7299 or by e-mail to swartlandmun@swartland.org.za, no later than 21 days after registration of the approval letter. A fee of R5 000,00 is to accompany the appeal and section 90 of the By-Law complied with, for the appeal to be valid. Appeals that are received late and/or do not comply with the aforementioned requirements, will be considered invalid and will not be processed;
 - (b) The objector be notified accordingly of the outcome of the decision;
- C. The application be refused for the following reasons:
 - (a) The proposed house shop is not complementary to the residential character of the area and will have a negative impact;
 - (b) The proposed use is in contradiction with the spatial planning of Abbotsdale;
 - (c) The application does not comply with the principle of SPLUMA and LUPA;
 - (d) The Municipal Planning Tribunal may not, in terms of Section 22(1) of SPLUMA approve a land use application that is inconsistent with the Municipal Spatial Development Framework (SDF) and no site specific circumstances were motivated in the application to, in terms of Section 22(2) of SPLUMA, justify a departure from the provisions of the SDF.

Rdl I S le Minnie spreek verder haar kommer uit oor die lae slaagsyfer vir leerlinglisensies. Sy beklemtoon dat die verkryging van 'n rybewys dikwels 'n voorvereiste vir indiensneming is en dat baie inwoners nie die geld het om herhaaldelik vir toetse te betaal nie. Sy wys daarop dat die nuwe elektroniese toetstelsel die proses moeiliker gemaak het en versoek of 'n vergelyking met ander munisipaliteite moontlik is — veral binne die Weskusstreek of die Wes-Kaap — om te bepaal of die probleem wydverspreid is.

Rdd J M de Beer doen navraag of Wetstoepassingsbeamptes verplig is om GPF-vergaderings by te woon.

Rdl A K Warnick verduidelik dat raadslede as ex-officio van die GPF's dien en dat Wetstoepassingsbeamptes hierdie vergaderings behoort by te woon om terugvoering te gee oor verordeningstoepassing en ander veiligheidsake. Hy beveel aan dat stasiebevelvoerders die nodige uitnodigings aan die beamptes rig om seker te maak hulle vorm deel van die struktuur.

Rdd J M de Beer meld dat daar by die afgelope paar GPF-vergaderings geen verteenwoordiging van Wetstoepassing was nie, en versoek dat die saak ondersoek word.

5.1.2 BRANDBESTRYDING

Rdd J M de Beer spreek waardering uit teenoor die Brandweer vir hul uitstekende reaksietyd en toewyding tydens die afgelope reeks brande binne die munisipaliteit, ten spyte van die groot afstande wat betrokke was.

Rdl D G Bess bedank die Brandweer vir hul hulp tydens die soektog na 'n vermiste kind, wat twee dae later gevind is, en het hul professionaliteit en volharding geloof.

Rdl A M Williams spreek opregte dank uit teenoor die Brandweer vir hul optrede tydens die onluste in Kalbaskraal, waar huise afgebrand is. Hy loof hul dapperheid en bereidwilligheid om hul lewens te waag ter wille van ander inwoners en meld dit dien as inspirasie vir die gemeenskap.

operation was conducted solely to distribute nine pamphlets, which would be a waste of resources. She suggested that the report be amended to clearly indicate that the pamphlets formed part of an ongoing awareness campaign or other related activities.

Cllr I S le Minnie further expressed her concern about the low pass rate for learner licences. She emphasised that obtaining a driver's licence is often a prerequisite for employment, and many residents cannot afford to pay repeatedly for tests. She points out that the new electronic testing system has made the process more difficult and requested whether a comparison with other municipalities — particularly within the West Coast region or the Western Cape — is possible to determine whether the problem is widespread.

Ald J M de Beer enquired whether Law Enforcement officers are required to attend CPF meetings.

Cllr A K Warnick explained that councillors serve as ex-officio members of the CPFs and that Law Enforcement officers should attend these meetings to provide feedback on by-law enforcement and other safety matters. He recommended that station commanders send the necessary invitations to ensure that officers form part of the structure.

Ald J M de Beer stated that at the last few CPF meetings there was no Law Enforcement representation and requested that the matter be investigated.

5.1.3 FIRE FIGHTING

Ald J M de Beer expressed appreciation to the Fire Department for their excellent response time and dedication during the recent series of fires in the municipality, despite the long distances involved.

Cllr D G Bess thanked the Fire Department for their assistance during the search for a missing child, who was found two days later, and praises their professionalism and perseverance.

Cllr A M Williams expressed sincere thanks to the Fire Department for their actions during the unrest in Kalbaskraal, where houses were set alight. He commends their bravery and willingness to risk their lives for the sake of other residents, stated that it serves as an inspiration to the community.

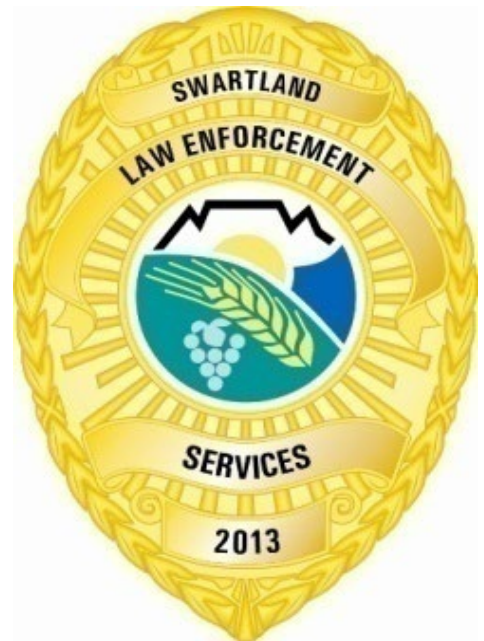

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1. INTRODUCTION

The Traffic and Law Enforcement Services of the Swartland Municipality fulfilled their legislative mandate and provided operational support to the South African Police Service (SAPS) in the prevention and combating of crime during December 2025.

These interventions were aimed at enhancing service delivery and contributing to an improved quality of life by promoting the safety and security of all residents and visitors within the Swartland Municipal area.

2. LAW ENFORCEMENT

This division ensures by-law compliance and provides education to all communities within the Swartland Municipal area.

2.1 MONITORING OF INFORMAL SETTLEMENTS

The Law Enforcement Division continues to monitor all informal settlements within the Swartland Municipal area to prevent and manage land invasions. Ongoing monitoring includes Phase 1, 3 and 4 Ilingilethu, Phola Park, Chatsworth, Riverlands, and Sibanye (Moorreesburg).

Targeted measures are in place to safeguard municipal land. Monitoring is also conducted in Kalbaskraal and on all CapeNature land within the municipal area in accordance with the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

Due to land invasion attempts, monitoring of HDA land in Chatsworth and Ilingilethu remains ongoing. Surveillance at De Hoop is conducted in support of Development Services, with drone footage shared accordingly.

Regular drone monitoring reports are submitted to Management

2.2 DOG UNIT (K9 UNIT)

The K9 Unit operates on 8-hour shifts within a 40-hour work week. Shift arrangements are adjusted to ensure enforcement coverage and to support the South African Police Service (SAPS) with crime prevention and crime combating operations in terms of the TPA Agreement.

During December 2025, the Unit reported the following activities:

- Assisted at **7 K78 roadblocks/VCPs**
- Conducted **6 crime prevention and joint operations**

A total of **321 searches** were conducted through VCPs, K78 roadblocks, and search-and-seizure operations in collaboration with SAPS. Detailed operational information is contained in this report.

The K9 Unit effected **16 arrests** during the reporting period.

2.3 LEAP UNIT

The LEAP Unit operates on 8-hour shifts, with shift arrangements adapted to ensure visibility across the Swartland Municipal area. The Unit supported the South African Police Service (SAPS) with crime prevention and crime combating activities during December 2025.

Activities for the reporting period included:

- **17 By-law enforcement operations**
- **22 Foot patrols**
- **7 Crime prevention joint operations**

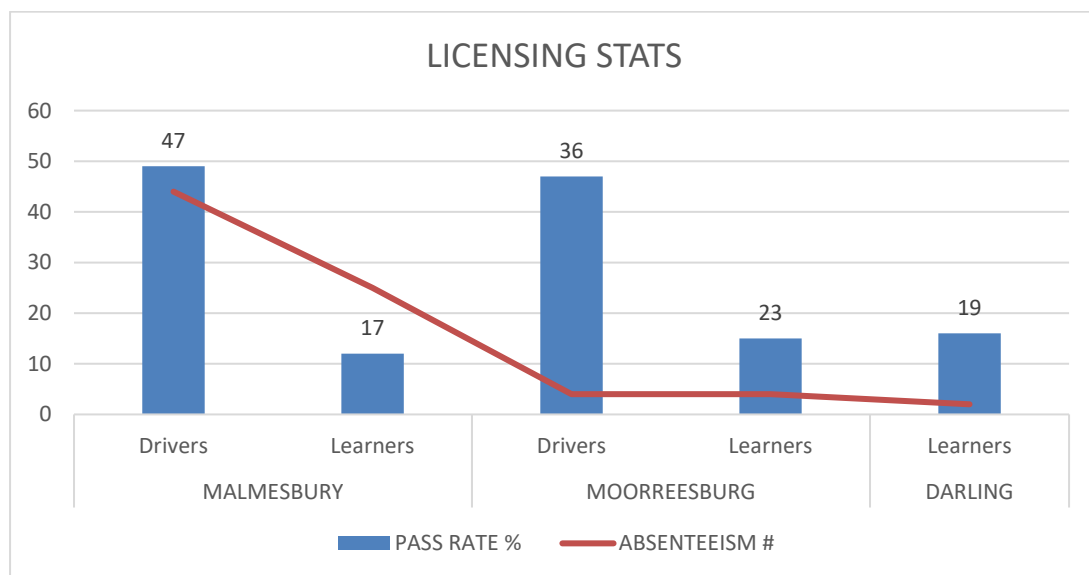
2.4 ILLEGAL DUMPING OPERATIONS

By-law awareness campaigns addressing illegal dumping remain ongoing throughout the Swartland Municipal area. These initiatives aim to educate residents and promote zero tolerance towards illegal dumping practices.

3. REGISTRATION AND LICENSING

3.1 DRIVING AND LEARNERS' LICENCES

Driving and learner licences contribute to economic participation and improved livelihoods by enabling access to employment opportunities. The following performance is reported for the Malmesbury, Moorreesburg, and Darling Driving Licence Testing Centres (DLTCs):

3.2 VEHICLE TESTING STATIONS (VTS)

During December 2025, a total of **72 roadworthy tests** were conducted at the Malmesbury Vehicle Testing Station, while **27 roadworthy tests** were conducted at the Moorreesburg Vehicle Testing Station.

4. TRAFFIC DIVISION

The Traffic Operational Division reports the following activities for December 2025:

- **Vehicle Checkpoints (VCPs): 25**
- **Foot Patrols: 61**

A total of **1,156 offences** were recorded during the month, combining cases reported by both Law Enforcement and Traffic Services.

4.1 WARRANT SECTION

The Warrant and Speed Section execute warrants daily. Special emphasis is placed on enhancing warrant execution and increasing the payment rate.

During December 2025, a total of **52 warrants** were finalized, with a combined value of **R64,500.00**

4.2 SPEEDING ENFORCEMENT

During December 2025, the four mobile speed cameras recorded **3,096 cases**, while fixed camera sites recorded **2,728 cases**. An additional **1,427 cases** were recorded by the ASOD on the R27 (West Coast Road).

A total of **7,251 speeding offences** were recorded for the month. Enhanced enforcement efforts were implemented to reduce road accidents.

4.3 AUTOMATED NUMBER PLATE RECOGNITION (ANPR) OPERATIONS

Eight (8) ANPR operations were conducted during December 2025, resulting in the collection of **R170,300** in outstanding traffic fines.

4.4 SAFETY AWARENESS

Four (4) educational and awareness programs were executed during December 2025, promoting road safety and compliance with traffic regulations.

5. KEY OPERATIONAL HIGHLIGHTS – DECEMBER 2025

- Ongoing management of the pig situation at small-scale farms continues to protect agricultural interests.
- The K9 Unit supported SAPS in intelligence-driven operations.
- Demolition of illegal structures across the Swartland remains ongoing.

- Efforts to collect outstanding fines through the ANPR system are showing increased success.
- The K9 and LEAP Units have been highly effective in crime prevention, supporting SAPS in terms of the CSF agreement.
- Collaborative operations with the WCLA continue successfully.
- By law enforcement efforts remain strong, addressing stray animals, illegal dumping, and traffic-related issues promptly and effectively.
- STLE provided support to SAPS in Malmesbury and Kalbaskraal in the fight against gang violence.
- Registration of spaza shops within the Swartland Municipal area is ongoing.
- Regular meetings and coordinated planning with all safety structures continue to foster a safe environment for all residents.
- Joint operations with SAPS and other stakeholders have yielded significant successes and strengthened integrated crime prevention initiatives.
- During the festive season, high-visibility deployments were conducted in Yzerfontein to ensure the safety of residents and visitors.
- A sponsored response vehicle, manned by all stakeholders, remained mobile along main routes and farm areas to respond to emergencies and incidents.

6. KEY RISKS AND CHALLENGES

- Non-compliance by pedestrians crossing the N7 remains a safety risk; interventions are planned with all relevant stakeholders.
- Overall disregard for laws and regulations by some members of the community continues to pose challenges to enforcement.
- Ongoing shootings in Malmesbury are being monitored, and SAPS remain actively engaged.
- The sale and consumption of alcohol contribute to incidents of gender-based violence and other criminal activities.
- General non-compliance with municipal by-laws persists across the community.
- A significant decline in learner's licence pass rates has been observed following the implementation of the electronic learner licence system.
- The illicit use and transportation of drugs along major routes, including the R27 and N7, remain a concern.

7. CONCLUSION

In conclusion, the Traffic and Law Enforcement Services of the Swartland Municipality remain dedicated to enhancing the safety and quality of life of all residents. Through proactive enforcement, community engagement, and collaboration with SAPS and other stakeholders, the Department continues to address crime, ensure by-law compliance, and promote road safety. These efforts reflect our ongoing commitment to creating a secure and well-governed municipal environment for all.

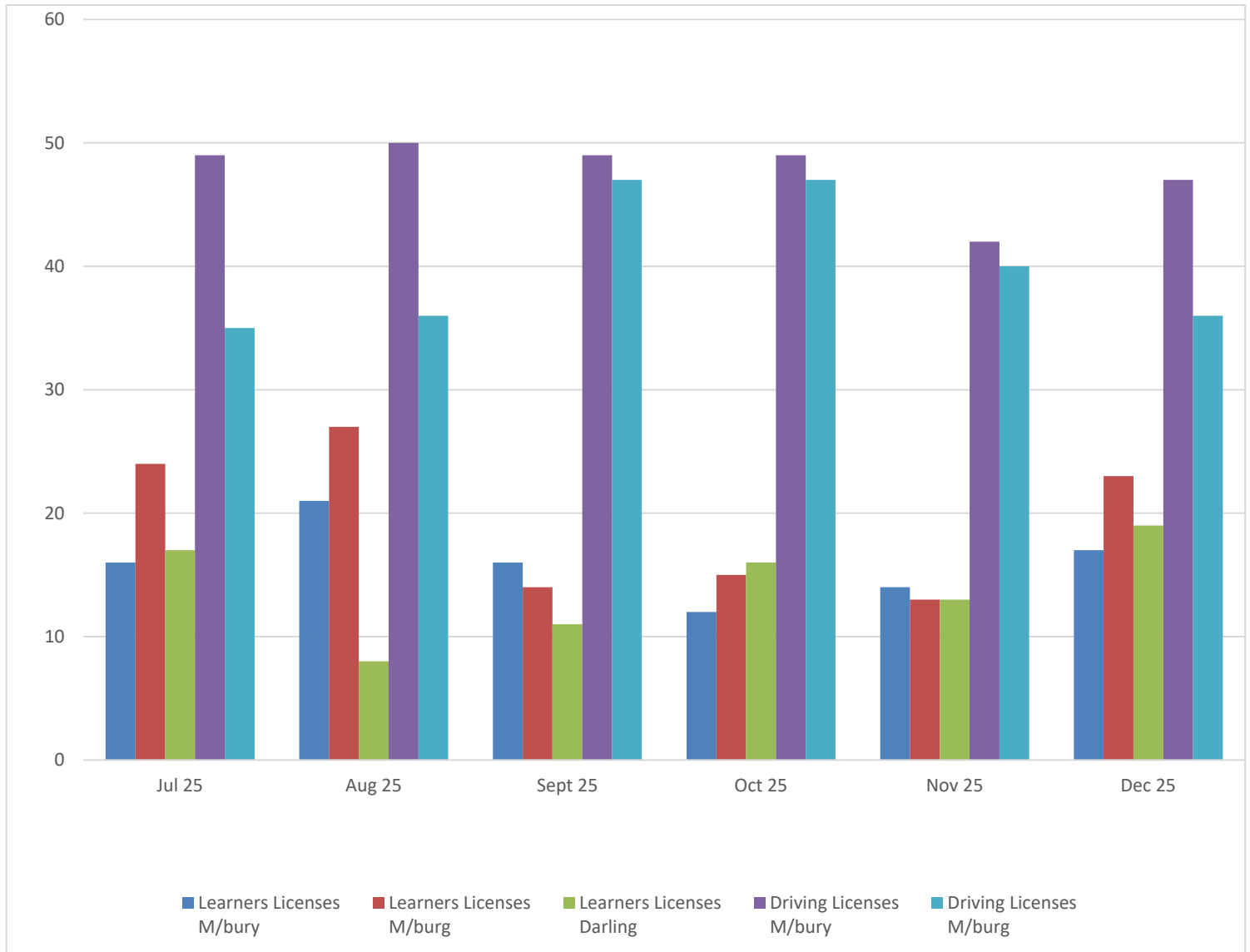

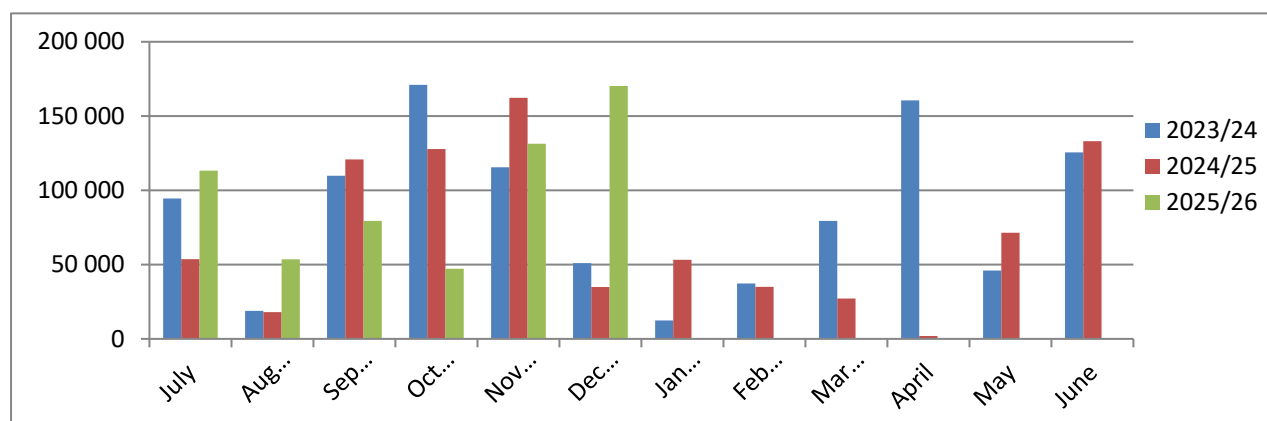

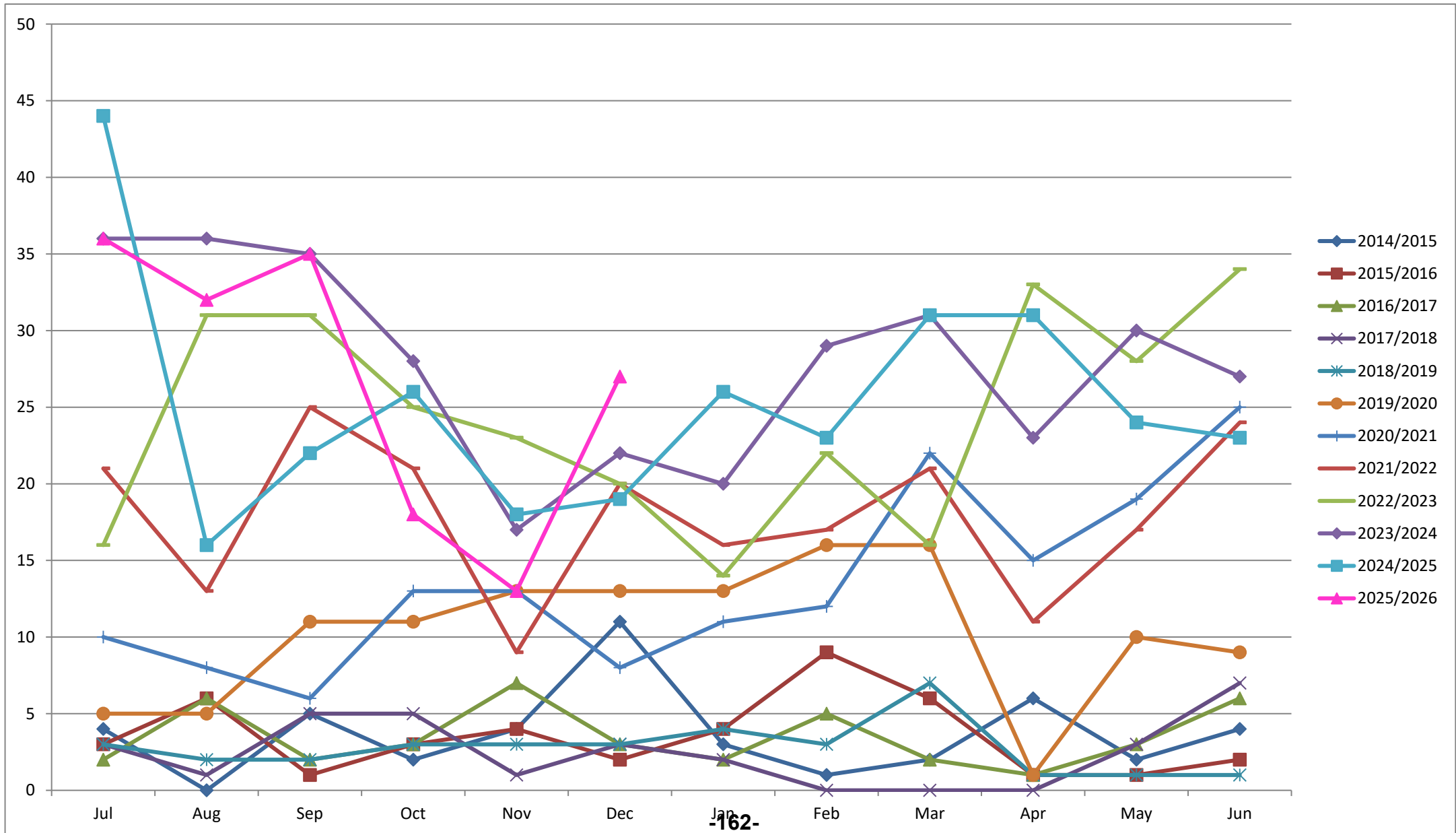
